Manchester City were left two points in front of champions Manchester United at the top of the English Premier League after a 1-0 win

David Silva scored the only goal of a highquality contest in the 53rd minute after Mario Balotelli cut in from the left and let fly with a powerful low shot that Arsenal keeper Wojciech Szczesny did well to save but could

Sergio Aguero followed up and, as the ball came loose on the right, Silva pounced to score from close range.

City missed several chances to double their lead and were almost made to pay when in-form Arsenal striker Robin van Persie received the ball just eight yards out only to shoot weakly at England goalkeeper Joe Hart.

Then Argentina defender Pablo Zabaleta nearly made

it 2-0 to the hosts when his shot beat Szczesny only to bounce off the keeper's right post.

Hart then preserved City's lead in the 90th minute when he tipped over a shot from Thomas Vermaelen that came through a crowd of players. In stoppage time, another Vermaelen strike curled just wide.

Defeat meant Arsenal, beaten for the first time in nine games, stayed fifth in the table, 12 points behind City. Earlier on Sunday, United returned to the

summit for a couple of hours after a 2-0 win away to Queens Park Rangers.

seconds to open the scoring at Loftus Road before Michael Carrick made the game safe for the visitors in the 56th minute.

United went ahead when England striker Rooney headed home a cross from Antonio Valencia after releasing the Ecuadorian down the right.

England international Carrick was allowed to advance by the Londoners' retreating defence and then beat Radek Cerny at the goalkeeper's near post with a shot from the edge of the box for what was

his first Premier League goal in nearly two years.

Meanwhile Tottenham moved up into third place, leapfrogging Chelsea to become London's top club, with a 1-0 win at home to strugglers Sunderland.

Russia striker Roman Pavlyuchenko scored the only goal of the game at White Hart Lane just after the hour mark.

A stray ball from Sunderland's Wes Brown found its way to Rafael van der Vaart, whose clever reverse pass allowed Pavlyuchenko to fire home the winner.

Liverpool went above Newcastle and into sixth spot with a 2-0 win away to Aston Villa.

Both their goals came from corners, with Craig Bellamy forcing the ball home from close range in the 11th minute.

And four minutes later, the unmarked Martin Skrtel rose highest to head in past American keeper Brad Guzan before Liverpool striker Luis Suarez was twice denied by

"We've got a really good spirit in the dressing room and it shows on the pitch. We've had a shut-out, scored two goals to increase our goals and points tally, and increased the number of times we've hit the woodwork as well."

Skibbe to replace **Babbel**

Hertha Berlin could name Michael Skibbe as the successor to sacked coach Markus Babbel as early as Thursday, according to reports in the German media on Monday.

Skibbe, 46, is currently in charge of Turkish side Eskisehirspor, having been sacked by Eintracht Frankfurt in March, but German daily Bild reported that he could sign a contract with Hertha until 2014.

Skibbe became the youngest coach in Bundesliga history when he took over Borussia Dortmund in 1998 at the age of 32.

He spent three years at Bayer Leverkusen between 2005 and 2008, and then spent several months at Turkish giants Galatasaray before joining Frankfurt two

years ago.

Former Bayern Munich and Liverpool defender Babbel, 39, was sacked by Hertha on Sunday.

ued as they won 1-0 at Cesena to climb to fifth place. Juve's win enabled them to leapfrog

by beating Siena 2-0 on Saturday. Udinese missed the chance to draw level with Antonio Conte's side when they were held to a 2-2 draw at Lazio

AC Milan, who had taken over at the top

and remain in third place, two points off the pace. Juve laboured to impose themselves

Barcelona coach Pep Guardiola has Spanish

title rivals Real Madrid and European glory firmly back in his sights after a trip to the Far East that yielded another world crown. Guardiola sealed the 13th title of his glit-

tering three-and-a-half-year reign on Sunday when the Catalans overpowered South American champions Santos 4-0, with Lionel Messi bagging a classy double. It was the perfect launchpad for 2012, Guardiola said, after a weekend on which

Real Madrid went three points clear of Barcelona at the top of La Liga with a thumping 6-2 win at Sevilla. European champions Barca arrived in

Japan last week after an impressive 3-1 win away at Real took them back to the top of the league in Spain. "It will be a surprise for me if the team gives up," Guardiola said of his side, countering

suggestions that after so much success his players could struggle for motivation. His men strive to "keep going forward", he said. "For us, our target is to play great football for the crowd, fight for the Spanish

league and travel around Europe to show people our level." "The success is all about the great players

and their effort," he said. But the 40-year-old admitted that his star-studded side's latest triumph had come at a cost after striker David Villa, linked with

injury, fractured his shin in the semifinal against Al Sadd. He is likely to be out for up to five months,

meaning he will likely miss most, if not all, of the rest of the season. Guardiola said in the immediate aftermath

of Villa's injury that it was "not respectful" to talk about the possibility of Barcelona buying a replacement in the winter transfer window. "His injury was the most unfortunate thing of this tournament, but I am sure that

he will return to the team soon," the coach said Sunday. South American champions Santos were

well beaten by Guardiola's team. They were 3-0 down at the break after goals from Messi, Xavi and Cesc Fabregas, and although they put up a spirited performance in the second half, it could not mask their shortcomings, particularly at the

The annual intercontinental tournament is hugely important in South America and coach Muricy Ramalho will face criticism when his side arrives home but he insisted there was no disgrace despite the heavy defeat.

"Barcelona have played various teams around the world and nobody can beat them. Eventually some team may, but I don't think it's possible now," he said.

"This was not embarrassing and it was not a blow to us. We need to be humble -- we were beaten by the best team in the world," he said, adding Messi was the best but that Neymar would one day take that title.
