FACING BNP, JAMAAT

AL, allies to move jointly

14-party meets to launch simultaneous campaign for war crimes trial

The Awami League-led 14-party alliance together with other like-minded parties will launch simultaneous political programmes across the country to resist the opposition BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami's latest "move to protect the war criminals".

The decision was made last night at a three-hour meeting of the ruling alliance, which also decided to mobilise public support in favour of the war crimes trial.

Chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, also AL president, the meeting held at the Gono Bhaban discussed the current political situation of the country.

The AL move comes against the backdrop of Sunday's street chaos in the capital and elsewhere in the country, which AL blames on BNP and its key ally Jamaat, claiming it was aimed at foiling the war crimes trial.

On Sunday, a series of crude homemade bombs went off in central Dhaka as hundreds of activists of BNP and Jamaat clashed with police, smashed more than a dozen vehicles and set some of those on fire.

Making money thru' stealing credit cards

Postal staff involved with the gang

If you have been waiting for a credit card in your mail, you cannot be sure that it will reach you. It is because several gangs, operating for more than two decades, in league

with postmen and post office employees in the capital, are active in stealing credit cards and charging those on a regular basis.

Members of one such gang, including a postman in the capital, who were arrested by police detectives early this month,

revealed how they make money by stealing credit cards. The postmen, who

are the key persons of the ring, do not register in the record book the arrival of parcels that potentially contain credit cards. So

there is no proof that the parcels made it to the post office. The postmen then open the parcels and hand the credit cards over to some good-looking members of their

The 61 administrators recently appointed to as many zila parishads do not have any specific tenure.


