Says Sahara

Home Minister Sahara Khatun yesterday said that Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) will be divided into four regions to bring dynamism in its activities.

She disclosed it at a reception programme arranged for 57 freedom fighters of Dhaka region from the paramilitary force having titles of Bir Shrestha, Bir Uttam, Bir Bikram and Bir Pratik.

Eight gallantry award-winning freedom fighters and family members of the martyrs attended the reception organised for marking the first anniversary of BGB after changing the force's name from Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) at BGB Headquarters in the city's Pilkhana.

After BDR mutiny on February 25-26 in 2009, the government renamed the 200 year-old force as BGB on December 20, 2010.

BGB began a journey afresh with Prime Minster Sheikh Hasina hoisting its flag on January 23, 2010. BGB chief Maj Gen Anwar Hossain at the event said a total of

817 personnel of the force had sacrificed their lives during the LiberationWar.

A total of 119 personnel of the force were given gallantry award. Of them, Lance Nayek Nur Mohammad Sheikh and Lance Nayek Munshi Abdur Rouf were awarded Bir Shrestha, the highest gallantry award in Bangladesh.

Another eight had been awarded Bir Uttam while 32 Bir Bikram and 77 Bir Pratik awards.

Sahara also declared to raise the BGB sectors from existing 12 to 16 to strengthen the force and make it time befitting.

The government is considering deployment of BGB personnel to the UN Peacekeeping Mission alongside the police and army, she said.

The BGB chief said this year around 7,000 personnel have been promoted while 1,961 personnel were recruited against the vacant posts in the force.

# BGB to get four Teesta deal soon: Rizvi Govt decision STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Signing of the delayed Teesta water sharing deal between Bangladesh and India will take

place very soon, said Foreign Affairs Adviser to the Prime Minister Gowher Rizvi yesterday at a dialogue in the city. Popular perception is that failure to sign the Teesta deal during the visit of Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to Bangladesh in September is a major setback to the

tionship, he said. The sooner it is signed the better, the adviser said.

improvement of Indo-Bangla bilateral rela-

Time is crucial in regard to signing the deal, Rizvi said adding three-fourth people of Bangladesh expect an improved relationship with India.

Bangladesh Enterprise Institute (BEI) and Delhi-based Observer Research Foundation (ORF) jointly organised the two-day dialogue on Bangladesh-India security, third of its kind, at a city hotel.

Though Indo-Bangla relationship experienced some success and progress in border demarcation, resolution of enclave issue, adversely possessed land, access to Teen Bigha corridor and duty-free export of 98 per cent commodities in recent times, signing of Teesta deal got stalled, said Rizvi.

The relationship could thrive further on water cooperation, joint river basin management and regional connectivity, he said.

Bangladesh and India share common aspiration for secularism, pluralism and peace, he said, and there is no such fundamental issue that should deteriorate the

Two slum dwellers challenged the government decision of evicting several slums in the city's Mirpur area before the High Court (HC) yesterday.

Abdus Salam and Abdul Jabbar, dwellers from two slums adjacent to police lines in Mirpur, section-14, filed the writ petitions challenging the order passed by Jatiya Grihayan Kartripakkha recently asking dwellers of several slums leave the area before Dec 24.

The order also mentioned that the authorities would conduct an eviction drive if the area is not cleared by the time.

The petitioners mentioned that they have been living in the slums for about 25 years and the sudden decision to evict those runs against relevant laws.

A HC bench held a hearing on the petition yesterday and fixed today for passing an order on the issue.

The petitions have been filed with legal assistance from Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust and advocate Khurshid Alam Khan is fighting for the petitioners.

# 2500 Yaba tablets seized, four women arrested

# Govt to drop 68 more cases against AL men

The government yesterday okayed the withdrawal of 68 more 'politically-motivated' cases filed against Awami League leaders during the tenure of the last government. The decision was taken at the 29th meeting of the

national committee formed to review such cases filed by the BNP-led 4-party alliance government. Speaking to reporters following the meeting at the home

ministry, State Minster for Law Quamrul Islam said "There are no cases involving any senior AL leader. All these cases are against leaders among the lower tier of the party." Answering to a question, he said no cases against any BNP

leaders were tabled at yesterday's meeting. With this, the committee has thus far recommended withdrawal of 7100 cases by considering those as 'politically motivated'. They, however, include 315 graft related cases filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

A total of 320 cases were placed before the meeting yesterday for withdrawal. The committee reviewed the cases and recommended 68 for withdrawal and rejected 188. Sixtyfour others were kept for review at the next meeting.
