Improve governance to maintain growth

Economists warn against failure

The economic growth of the country may falter in the coming days for the failure to improve governance, economists have warned. The caution comes after Bangladesh's

economy has grown by more than five percent per year in the last two decades, drawing attention of many thinkers as to how a country with a relatively poor governance can maintain growth in GDP and in per capita income.

Unveiling a joint study at a discussion, economist Prof Wahiduddin Mahmud

yesterday said rise in small entrepreneurship, garment exports, remittance earnings and increase in farm production has contributed much to the country's past economic expansion.

An improvement in governance during the 1990s after transition to democracy from military rule also supported the growth.

But the country's governance score has been dropping almost constantly since 2004, with its rank falling near the bottom quartile of the developing countries, said the study citing World Governance Indicators Index.

The 58-year-old was found dead in the afternoon.




