

Stage One Dhaka, in association with Mukul and the Ghetto Tigers and Dhaka Film Society is bringing back "Sonata" -- a one-act play by Mahesh Elkunchwar -- to three Dhaka venues. "Sonata" was translated and adapted into a bilingual (Bangla and English) play by Leesa Gazi and staged in London in 2008. The play was staged in Dhaka in 2010. The highly successful performances in London were extremely significant for the British Bangladeshi actors since it was the first time that actors of Bangladeshi origin worked professionally in mainstream

English theatre. Two years later, in January 2010,

"Sonata" received critical acclaim in Dhaka. "Sonata" is about three women who have left Bangladesh to make England, and more specifically, London, their home. The play explores the psychological and physical impact of displacement and the bonds of friendship between the three single women. The action takes place in Bipasha and Dolon's shared flat during a typical Sunday evening. Their lively, entertaining and frequently challenging exchanges reveal their relationship with each other and the world outside. The three friends - Bipasha, Dolon and Ria -- are being played by

> that bonded the materials. The artist knows where to stop -which is a strong suit of his paintings He avoids rigid forms and overembellishment. As a result, a good sense of proportion is noticed in his works. He has a fascination with local materials. The materials are easily available and cheap. One remarkable feature of his works at the exhibition is that he has pasted paper (grimy, uneven and torn) on corrugated board for a number of his works. Corrugated board is another

medium that enables him to portray his

illusions and fantasies.

"The materials' rough texture and rutted surface give me some advantages; I can easily apply colours and create ments. The painter has used special glue lines. Most of the time, the paper encourages me to create something novel," he says. The artist has worked on them in acrylic, oil, pencil and other mediums to portray varied surrealistic, geometric patterns and symbolic images. His relationship with geometric abstraction has made him one of the pioneers of abstract painting in our country. Some of his works feature scribbles and clean compositions -- articulating fantasy, longing and melancholy.

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

Welles' "Citizen Kane" Oscar sells for \$861,542

The best screenplay statuette awarded

in 1942-- the only Oscar given to

"Citizen Kane".

Orson Welles' Oscar for writing "Citizen Kane"-- regarded as one of the best films ever made -- sold for \$861,542 on Tuesday as a hot market for Hollywood memorabilia helped erase memories of an unsuccessful auction four years ago.



The best screenplay statuette awarded in 1942-- the only Oscar given to Citizen Kane-failed to meet its undisclosed reserve price when it was last up for auction at Sotheby's New York in 2007. At that time it was expected to sell for around \$1 Although tarnished by age,

the Oscar, sold by Los Angeles auction house Nate D. Saunders on behalf of its anonymous seller, carried a reserve price of between \$600,000 and \$1 million. Bids came in from around the world in what the auction house termed an "exciting" sale. "This is a testament to the

popularity of Orson Welles and his magnum opus Citizen Kane," said Nate D. Saunders.

owner of the auction house, in a statement The Oscar has a story worthy of a Hollywood movie in its own right. Welles had lost it, but it resurfaced after his 1985 death when it was put up for auction in 1994 by a cinematographer, who claimed Welles had given it



After a legal battle, Beatrice Welles was given the right to dispose of the Oscar. She sold it to a California non-profit organization called the Dax Foundation, who tried unsuccessfully to auction it in 2007.

In a bid to stop public sales, the Academy in 1950 introduced an agreement that banned winners from selling their Oscars to anyone but the Academy for the nominal sum of \$1. But several pre-1950s Oscars

have gone under the hammer in recent years, including the best picture Oscar for the 1939 film "Gone with the Wind," which was sold for a record \$1.54 million in 1999 to Michael Jackson. "Citizen Kane," a 1942 drama about the ruthless

pursuit of power, which Welles also directed and starred in, regularly tops U.S. and British lists of the greatest film of all time.
