Milan regain top spot

Rovers rooted to the bottom

Blackburn Rovers were left bottom of the English Premier League after a 2-1 Lancashire derby defeat at home to fellow relegation candidates Bolton Wanderers at Ewood Park on Tuesday.

Bolton, who kicked off as the league's basement club and remained in the bottom three even after this win, enjoyed a sensational start.

Mark Davies put them ahead inside five minutes and Nigel Reo-Coker made it 2-0 on the half-hour.

Davies's goal reignited the terrace taunts from Rovers fans towards manager Steve Kean, who has been under fire since he was appointed by Venky's, the Indian-based poultry firm that owns the club, a year ago.

However, the jeers were stilled when Blackburn striker

got for Rovers, Premier League champions in 1995.

It had been suggested before kick-off that whichever of the two Scottish managers on show

ended up on the losing side could be sacked before Christmas and Bolton boss Owen Coyle sympathised with Kean.

"I feel for Steve - the shoe could have been on other foot but I'm delighted to come out on the right end of the result, Coyle told the BBC.

Cries of "Kean Out" could be heard all round Ewood Park after Bolton took a fifth minute lead when, after Rovers failed to clear a corner, David Ngog cut the ball back to Mark Davies whose first-time shot beat Paul Robinson.

And a well-worked move saw Bolton double their lead in the 30th minute.

Reo-Coker, making the most of yet more poor defending, burst through the middle and found Martin Petrov on the left. Morten Gamst Pedersen failed to deal with Petrov's mis-

hit cross but Reo-Coker, despite having his back to goal, was still able to turn and score.

Gunners to sell Arshavin

Arsenal is ready to sell out of favour Russian midfielder Andrei Arshavin to his home club Zenit Saint Petersburg for his original transfer sum of 16.5 million euros (\$21.6 million), a report said Wednesday.

Moscow's respected Sovietsky Sport daily said Zenit was interested in acquiring the 30-year-old Russia skipper and eventually assigning him to coach its youth club.

Sovietsky Sport said its source confirmed that "Arsenal is ready to enter negotiations with Zenit."

The report comes on the heels of British media speculation that Arsenal boss Arsene Wenger had decided to part with his struggling playmaker during the January transfer window.

"We are always interested in Arshavin," Zenit director Igor Korneyev told Sovietsky

Sport. "But I can neither confirm nor deny whether we

have received an offer."

Arshavin's stock soared when he spearheaded one of the most dazzling Russian sides in decades to a semifinal appearance to in the Euro 2008 championship.

Arsenal signed him early the following year after paying a 16.5-million-euro transfer and saw him make an immediate impact with six goals in 12 games.

But he only scored once in the Premier League in 13 appearances this season and has only started for the squad on six occasions.

Union backs Suarez verdict

Luis Suarez's eight-game ban for racially abusing Patrice Evra has "sent out a strong message" according to the chief executive of England's Professional Footballers' Association.

Gordon Taylor said the punishment was

timely given the outcry in England after FIFA president Sepp Blatter suggested racist incidents on the field could be settled by a handshake between the players involved -- comments the head of world football's governing body later retracted.

Liverpool striker Suarez is set to appeal the ban, imposed after a confrontation with Manchester United's Evra during a 1-1 Premier League draw at Anfield in October. The Uruguay international's defence appeared to rest on

the view that language which was viewed as offensive in England was acceptable in his homeland. Meanwhile Liverpool have reacted furiously to the pun-

ishment imposed upon Suarez, also fined £40,000 on Tuesday, accusing the Football Association of being "determined" to find the 24-year-old guilty. But Taylor said Wednesday: "This was an independent

commission experienced in law and football and they must have had compelling evidence, and it sends out a very strong message to the rest of the world.

"I understand the point about cultural differences but if you come to this country all players have to abide by not just the laws of the game but the laws of the land as well.

"Referring to someone's skin colour has got to be offensive -- it's self-evident."

Spain at the zenith

World and European champions Spain will end the year as the world's number one ranked football team after the FIFA rankings were announced on Wednesday.

Spain, who thus secure top spot for the fourth consecutive year, were ousted only once in 2011 when they handed first place to Netherlands for a one-month spell in August.

Since the last rankings were announced on November 23, the top 15 remains unchanged with Netherlands in second, Germany third, Uruguay fourth and England fifth.


