Football season starts today

After a four and a half month gap between seasons, a new spell of football will be underway today through the qualifying round of season's curtain raiser tournament, Grameenphone Federation Cup at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

Bangladesh Navy will face Cox's City in the opening match before Beanibazar SC take on Wari Club in the second match under the floodlights.

The 2011-12 football season was supposed to begin from October like last season but the football governing body deferred the start by two-and-a-half months due to the AFC U-19 Championship in Bangladesh as well as the preparation of the national football team for the SAFF Championship which ended in December 11 in India.

The Bangladesh Football Federation took 11 months to complete the 2010-11 season despite having started the Federation Cup

from October 10. The fourth Bangladesh League consumed more than 180 days for a meagre 132 games following the sudden insertion of the Independence Cup in the middle of the professional league.

Last season ended through the Super Cup final between two archrivals Abahani and Mohammedan on August 6 and since then there has been no competition in senior level.

This time around, the Federation Cup will see 12 teams including seven clubs of the second-tier professional football league (Bangladesh Championship League) take part in a knock-out basis. Five teams will qualify for the 16-team final round where the 11 clubs of the Bangladesh Premier League are waiting.

As five teams will advance to the final round, seven clubs who are going to play the inaugural Bangladesh Championship League will be trying to fine-tune their squads as well as looking for a long stay in the Federation Cup through qualifying for the finals.

Int'l hockey returns to Pakistan

Pakistan came from two goals down Thursday to beat a much improved China 5-3, taking the lead 2-0 in a four-match series that marks the first international hockey in the troubled country for seven years.

Forwards Waqas Sharif and Haseem Khan hit two goals each with Ali Shah netting once to lead Pakistan's fight-back after China dominated initial play with two goals by the 11th minute.

Pakistan won the first match 3-0 on Wednesday in Karachi, in the first international hockey hosted by Pakistan in seven years.

A campaign of Taliban and Al-Qaeda linked attacks across Pakistan, including an attack on the Sri Lankan cricket team in 2008, has made Pakistan a virtual "no go" zone for international sport.

China struck in the third minute when striker Dong Yang scored off the first penalty corner, going under the feet of Pakistani goalkeeper Salman Akbar, who had a miserable match.

Liu Xiang Tang doubled the lead in the 11th minute when he sneaked past Pakistan's defence to score a field goal, much to the shock of Pakistan.

Awoken by their rivals' sudden surge, Pakistan struck three times within the next 14 minutes as Khan (14 and 28 minutes) and Waqas Sharif (23 minutes) put Pakistan ahead with 3-2.

Yang pulled one back in the 54th minute in a slick move from the forward line before Sharif ended the score with another field goal in the 56th minute.

KP to stay at Surrey

England star Kevin Pietersen has committed his future to Surrey for as long as he remains an international player, it was confirmed on Thursday.

Pietersen is currently a centrally contracted player with England and has no fixed term for his county career at Surrey.

However, Surrey announced in a statement that Pietersen, 31, had pledged to remain with the county for the duration of his central contract with England, which is reviewed every 12 months.

"England batsman Kevin Pietersen has extended his contract with Surrey County Cricket Club until the end of his central contract with England," Surrey said in a statement.

Pietersen joined Surrey on loan in 2010 after a spell at Hampshire before agreeing a one-year deal for 2011.

Shakib numero uno

Concerned about long gaps between Test series

Shakib Al Hasan received another feather on his impressive cap as the former Bangladesh captain became the number one ranked all-rounder in the ICC Test player rankings.

It was a double delight for the 24-year-old who also holds the number one position in the ODI rankings.

Nothing could have been better than the way the prolific all-rounder signed off the year, and the usually reserved man was also delighted by the achievement.

"Without any doubt it's great news for me and for the country's cricket and I'm really happy. I have had the self-belief that it will come my way sooner or later because you know for a long time I was in the top five, so it was a matter of time," said Shakib in his instant reaction.

The laurel came his way for the first time in his career through his splendid all-round performance against Pakistan in the second Test match at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur.

Shakib became the first Bangladesh

player to hit a century and take a five-for in the same Test when he slammed 144 before falling victim to a run-out and added a haul of 6-82 in Pakistan's first innings. It was the first instance of a player scoring a hundred and taking a five-for in the same Test since Pakistan legend Imran Khan did it in 1983.

"It's fantastic that the performance in the last Test in the year helped me to achieve this feat but it would be much better if we could manage a good result from the last Test match. We could have celebrated this success in great fashion if we had a good result under our belt," opined Shakib.

The staggering performance in the Mirpur Test, which Bangladesh lost by seven wickets, not only earned the Magura lad the man-of-the-match award but also elevated him four places in the all-rounders' rankings, placing him at the top of the tree.

Shakib, who has also improved his bowling and batting rankings, gathered 404 points while South African all-rounder Jacques Kallis followed him with 397 points. In the Reliance ICC Player Rankings for Test batsmen, Shakib vaulted seven places to claim a career-best 31st position while in

bowling chart he climbed two spots to claim seventh position.

It's not any easy task for any player to bracket himself among the top-ranked players in the world when his team has such a poor record in the international circuit, but the ever-confident Shakib said that he follows one simple mantra: try to give your best regardless of what others are doing.

"I always try to give my best, which is the only motivation behind my success. We have a lot of scope to improve as a team and I believe it can only happen if every individual gives his best and always tries to improve his performance. Actually I'm not thinking too much and trying to take everything in my stride," said Shakib when asked about how he stays motivated when his team loses one match after another.

Undoubtedly, losing the captaincy after a disastrous Zimbabwe tour was the low point this year for the impressive performer but the man himself was hardly bothered about the captaincy.

"Believe me, it only matters whether I am playing for my country or not. I am not thinking about additional duties. And once again I want to say that I take

ASIAN SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIP

Squad likely to be trimmed

The National Shooting Federation of Bangladesh (NSF) is likely to cut down the nine-member squad for the Asian Shooting Championship to only four due to the financial crisis although they have sought financial help from the clubs to send their respective players to the championship.

Nine players have initially been selected for the 12th edition of the Asian Shooting Championship, which will see a total of 35 shooters from 14 events to earn the quota place in the 2012 London Olympics.

The championship will get underway from January 11 in Doha, Qatar.

"We are mostly likely to send four shooters in the championship due to financial problem but if the clubs come forward to sponsor their respective shooters, the number of shooters might be increased," said NSF general secretary Ishaque Ahmed yesterday.

However, the fact is that Bangladesh have never earned any quota places in Olympics and have always played through the wild card system.

The preliminary squad includes Sharmin

Minhaz gains 3rd & final IM norm

Fide Master Minhaz Uddin Ahmed earned his third and final International Master (IM) norm when he beat Golam Mostofa in the tenth round of the Walton 37th National Chess Championship yesterday.

Minhaz won the second norm in the Grand Masters' Chess Tournament in India's Andhra Pradesh last month while in 2008 he earned his first IM norm in the National Chess Championship. He is currently joint third in the ongoing championship with seven points.

In the other matches of the day at the Bangladesh Olympic Association Media Hall, Mohammadan Sporting Club's Grand Master Ziaur Rahman defeated Titas Club's Sohail Chowdhury. As a result, Sohail was also in the third place with Minhaz.

The tournament's most senior Grand Master Niaz Murshed remained in second position with eight points after defeating Destiny's Fide Master Deboraj. Biman's IM Abu Sufian Shakil defeated Pritom-Prism Chess Club's Sohel Chowdhury. As a result, Shakil was also in the third place with Minhaz.

Today, Deboraj will face Zia, Minhaz will face Sohel Chowdhury, Shakil will face Mahfuz, Mehdi Hasan will face Mahtab Uddin, Shakil will face Mostafa, and Javed will face Monir in the 11th round matches at the same venue.
