

## Bangladesh symbol of communal harmony Says president

President Zillur Rahman said Bangladesh is a symbol of communal harmony where people of all religions have been living peacefully.

The president said this at a reception hosted by him for members of the Christian community at Bangabhaban in the city on the occasion of Christmas yesterday.

Zillur welcomed the guests and exchanged greetings with them.

He cut a big cake marking the occasion while some children of Christian community sang Christmas carol during the reception.

## Jahed confesses to killing Kafil

"I strangled Kafil and, later, cut the veins on his neck and right hand so that police could not suspect me as the killer," confessed the person who allegedly killed university student Mohammad Kafil Uddin in the port city last Monday.

The self-confessed killer, Md Jahed Mahmud, 20, son of Selim Mahmud, hailed from the city's Bagmoniram Lane area, was arrested on Saturday.

Police also recovered Tk 12,500 cash, a laptop and a school bag, all belonging to Kafil, from Jahed's residence.

Confessing his crime before the media at Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) headquarter yesterday, Jahed said, "I have killed Kafil by strangulating him and I should be punished for my crime."

Admitting his attraction towards detective serials and novels, he admitted to have cut Kafil's veins with an anti-cutter to avoid suspicion.

CMP Commissioner Abul Kashem, terming the murder pre-planned, said Jahed had greed for Kafil's money and laptop.

"He took part at Kafil's namaz-a-janaza at Anwara and also went to Kafil's house so that no one would suspect him as the killer," he said. Police said Jahed and Kafil were friends and worked as members of Destiny-2000.

On December 18, Jahed took Kafil to a cafe in Lalkhan Bazar and, later on, took Kafil to a spot adjacent to Jamiatul Falah Mosque to chit chat, said police.

Next day, police found the body of Kafil, a student of International Islamic University Chittagong, from the area.


On the occasion, AL Magura district unit and its front organisations arranged various programmes to commemorate his life and works.

## Plan to improve environment of govt primary schools

The government has taken an initiative to build improved infrastructures and facilities for primary schools and create an improved environment for students and teachers.

To achieve the objectives, Executive Committee of the National Economic Council recently approved a Tk 169.33 crore "Primary Education Development Project".

Directorate of Primary Education under Ministry of Primary and Mass Education will implement the project by June 2014.

Of the total cost, the government will provide Tk 32.53 crore while Tk 136.80 crore will come as project assistance from Islamic Development

Bank (IDB), said a planning ministry official. The project also aims at enrolling all children in primary schools and provide teachers and students in the project areas with improved sanitation, safe drinking water and education related materials.

The project will cover 75 upazilas of 20 districts -- Naogaon, Pabna, Sirajganj, Kurigram, Lalmonirhat, Bagerhat, Jessore, Khulna, Gopalganj, Kishoreganj, Manikganj, Munshiganj, Sherpur, Chandpur, Chittagong, Comilla, Barisal, Jhalakathi, Sunamganj and Sylhet.

Under the project, a total of 180 buildings, including 160 two-storied buildings with a four-storey foundation, will be built in the plains and 20 three-storied buildings in flood-prone and low-lying areas.

Besides, there will be separate toilets for male

and female students, arsenic-free tube wells, facility to preserve rainwater and solar panels.

The planning ministry sources said the government struck a US \$18 million loan agreement with IDB on July 2, 2011 for the project.

The loan carries an annual service charge of 2.50 percent, including a seven year grace period, with the principal amount to be repaid in 25 years.

They said two projects, including the government primary school construction project (second phase), completed in June 2009, were implemented under IDB's financial assistance.

Later, a survey carried out by Local Government Engineering Department found that a notable number of schools across the country are in dilapidated condition.

## Trader cheats death, then dies

Within minutes of cheating death twice, a vegetable vendor met his sad demise at Kalihati upazila in Tangail yesterday.

The deceased Mohammad Ilias, 35, hailing from Ghatnagar village under Gomostapur upazila in Chapainawabganj district, was travelling atop a tomato-laden truck with two other vendors.

As the truck entered the approach road of Bangabandhu Bridge at Dhalatengur area around 7:00am, a passenger bus slammed it from behind. Just as the vendors were recovering from the shock, the truck skidded and fell into a roadside ditch, said police.

Ilias, reeling from the accident, received a call on his cellphone, only to inadvertently walk onto an adjacent rail track and right in the path of Dhaka-bound train, which ran him over, killing him on the spot.


