DRS the talking point

Honours even on opening day

India's rejection of the Decision Review System (DRS) in their Australian series provoked its first controversy Monday as the home side lost late wickets on the opening day of the first Test.

The Australians stumbled from 205 for three with three wickets tumbling in 18 balls to finish the day at 277 for six with Brad Haddin on 21 and Peter Siddle not out 34.

But the first day of the four-Test series before a 70,068 Boxing Day crowd at the Melbourne Cricket Ground was marred by the contentious dismissal of senior batsman Michael Hussey.

Hussey fell for his third Test golden duck in eight innings and was disgusted to be given out after replays appeared to show the delivery from Zaheer Khan had brushed his sleeve and not his bat.

Hussey was prevented from referring the umpire's verdict to the video umpire as the Indian cricket board has refused to use the DRS in the series over concerns about the accuracy of electronic aids.

It could prove a career-ending dismissal for Hussey, whose future in the Australian team is increasingly under threat amid a run of low scores.

"I feel for any batsman who gets out, it's a bit of a gut-wrenching experience, whether it's your first ball or you're 150," said Ed Cowan, who anchored the Australian innings with a stoic 68 on his debut.

"Of course, I was disappointed for him [Hussey]. It was a massive moment in the

game, it was a huge momentum [switch].

"We just had a 100-run partnership, wrestled back momentum and then almost a 50-run partnership and we felt we were half an hour away from nailing them, really grinding them into the dust."

Cowan said it was not an issue of the DRS but the vagaries of umpiring decisions.

"Today momentum went against us because of it. Two of your top six [batsmen], but that's the game and we'll take the good

with the bad," he said.

Indian paceman Umesh Yadav, who took three wickets, refused to be drawn into the controversy. "It's part of the game and I'd rather not comment on it," Yadav said. "Whether it's bad or good decisions, it's part of the game."

Australia were in a strong position before paceman Zaheer Khan, playing in his first Test match since July, removed Clarke and Hussey with consecutive deliveries.

Cowan went three overs later ending a 294-minute vigil when he feathered a catch



Only the best for Asia Cup

Little room in the ICC's Future Tours Programme has reshaped the Asia Cup into a tournament for the elites.

The regional cricket tournament which will be held at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in the capital early next year, has been squeezed into the packed international schedules of India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh. This has limited the number of teams, spurning the participation of Associate nations.

The last time the smaller cricketing nations played in the competition was in 2008 when the United Arab Emirates and Hong Kong qualified through the ACC Trophy. Since 2010, the tournament has been made exclusive to the Test playing nations and in one venue too.

But Asian Cricket Council CEO Syed Ashraful Huq was confident that their arrangement will stay in shape in the near future, though by spreading their net wider.

"We are grateful to the Test playing nations for making time in their packed schedules for the Asia Cup," he said during the launch ceremony of Asia Cup's eleventh edition which was also attended by BCB and ACC president AHM Mustafa Kamal, BCB media com-

mittee chairman Jalal Yunus and BCB CEO Manzur Ahmed at a local hotel yesterday.

"The cause of development and Asia is big in their hearts. Next year the ACC is holding an Under-19 Asia Cup in Malaysia and a women's Asia Twenty 20 Cup in China, with the Test playing

nations being involved which gives our top developing teams a chance to play against the best," said Ashraful.

It is only through these tournaments that the ACC can stay in the game, so to say, but the increasing pressure from bilateral series has given the tournament organisers a lot of headaches. There were strong reports that the Asia Cup could be shelved this year due to a proposed India-Pakistan series but since that threat has passed, the tournament has been compressed into an 11-day meet.

Bangladesh will be holding the tournament for the third time, the other two times being in 1988 and 2000.

Sri Lanka finished the day on 289 for seven, with Samaraweera (86 not out) and Chandimal (58) adding 111 for the sixth wicket after Marchant de Lange, South


Africa's new fast bowler, had ripped out three of Sri Lanka's leading batsmen.

De Lange took another wicket in the last over of the day when he had Thisara Perera caught at short leg to finish with four for 60 in his first day in Test cricket.

De Lange, 21, who received a late call-up after Vernon Philander was ruled out by a knee injury, had Sri Lanka in trouble at 162 for five on a good batting pitch after dismissing Tharanga Paranavitana, Kumar Sangakkara and Angelo Mathews.


