OIL-BASED POWER PLANTS

Govt may ask pvt producers to import fuel

The government may ask private power producers to import fuel on their own, as Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation is unwilling to bear huge bills for soaring fuel imports, Power Division officials said.

The Division has sent a proposal to that end to the cabinet committee on economic affairs, which will be placed in a committee meeting today.

The Energy Division early this year sent a letter to the Power Division expressing concern over huge fuel imports. It said the BPC has been incurring huge losses for selling fuel at prices lower than that on the international market. BPC's cumulative loss stood at around Tk 20,000 crore till January this year.

The amount of losses will go up for supplying fuel to new power plants, and it will be difficult for the BPC to store up and supply large quantity of fuel, read the letter.

In its proposal, the Power Division mentioned that it requires 500 tonnes of furnace oil to run a 100-megawatt power plant for 24 hours.

Wishing anonymity, an official of the Division said they started importing additional fuel for quick rental power plants from the last fiscal year.

Secret killings on the rise

Rights body ASK worried as 51 people went missing last year

The number of mysterious disappearances and secret killings saw an alarming rise in 2011 compared to the previous years, shows a report of rights organisation Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK).

Fifty-one people vanished last year, with 15 bodies being recovered later, according to the report published yesterday.

Allegations are that members of law enforcement agencies, particularly those of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab), were involved in those incidents, ASK Executive Director Sultana Kamal said sharing the findings of the report at a press conference at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

"People simply disappeared and, in some cases, their

He puts his father's T-shirt on the pillow as he sleeps. That way, he feels the presence of his father --- caring, loving, warm.

The T-shirt now hardly bears the familiar smell of the sweat of his father, who was abducted more than three years ago on July 22, 2008. And yet Sajjad Islam, a student of class IV, keeps his father's garment on his pillow in a vain attempt to
