APPOINTMENT OF NEW ELECTION COMMISSIONERS

President's talks to fail: Moudud

The president's dialogue on the appointment of new election commissioners will fail as he has discriminated against some political parties in his invitation, said BNP Standing Committee Member Barrister Moudud Ahmed yesterday.

As part of the government's plan, some registered political parties were intentionally left uninvited as they supported the four-party alliance while some unregistered parties favouring the government were invited, he said.

Moudud was speaking as chief guest at a discussion organised by Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Sangskritik Dal at Jatiya Press Club in the city.

"The president did not follow any specific principle while inviting political parties to the dialogue. The purpose of the dialogue will not be successful as it was designed by the government," said Moudud. Despite knowing that the dialogue

would fail, BNP will attend it to voice

people's demand to restore the caretaker government system to hold the next general election, he added. Moudud criticised the Sector Commanders Forum for being "a pro-

Awami League organisation" and its leaders for not showing due respect to M Hamidullah Khan, a sector commander who passed away recently. **BNP Standing Committee Member**

Gayeshwar Chandra Roy said even if the prime minister appoints her family members as chief election commissioner and the caretaker government's chief adviser, the Awami League will get not more than 30 seats in the next general election.

He said it is not the BNP but the gov-

ernment which must restore the caretaker government system by placing and passing it in parliament to ensure a fair and transparent general election.

If the government holds a "secret"

taker government system, many Awami League parliament members will cast their votes in favour of the system, said Gayeshwar. The government, having failed in all sectors because of its corruption, nepotism and partisanship, is using the war

popularity among the people, he added. Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Sangskritik Dal President Major (retd) MM Mehbub Rahman chaired the discussion.

BNP chairperson's adviser Barrister Haider Ali and National Democratic Party Chairman Khandaker Golam Murtoza also spoke on the occasion.

Prothom Alo editor gets bail

The High Court yesterday granted bail to Prothom Alo **Editor and Publisher Matiur** Rahman for two months in a defamation case filed in Khulna.

The HC bench of Justice Salma Masud Chowdhury and Justice Shahidul Karim passed the order of bail after disposing of a petition filed by Matiur Rahman seeking bail in the case. The Prothom Alo editor appeared before the bench for bail yesterday.

Deputy Attorney General Khondker Diliruzzaman told reporters that one Mizanur Rahman Mizan of Khulna had filed the defamation suit with the court of chief judicial magistrate of the district against the Prothom Alo editor and its reporter Iftekhar Mahmud after the daily published a report headlined, "Khuner Parikalpanay Khulna Awami League Er Char Neta! (Four Khulna Awami League leaders behind the murder plan!) on October 6 last year.

He also said that Matiur Rahman filed the bail petition on December 31 last year in connection with case, and Iftekhar Mahmud, another accused in the case, earlier got bail from the trial court.

Dr Kamal Hossain appeared for the Prothom Alo editor.

Phensidyl bottles concealed in vegetable sacks

5 arrested, truck seized

Detective police seized 2,500 bottles of phensedyl from a vegetable-laden truck and arrested five alleged drug peddlers in this connection from the city's Gabtoli area yesterday.

Senior Assistant Commissioner Mashiur Rahman of Detective Branch (DB) of police, who led the drive, said, on information that a gang of drug peddlers were coming from Dinajpur in guise of vegetable traders, they seized a truck in front of Parbat Cinema Hall after chasing it from the Gabtoli Bridge around 1:15am.

The phensedyl bottles were found in 15 cabbage sacks and 11 tomato carrying baskets in the truck alongside other rotten vegetables.

The arrestees, Towfiq Elahi Milton, 40, Khokon Chowdhury alias DIG Khokon, 45, Faruque Miah, 32, Abdus Salam, 30, and Faraz Mollah, 24, were all caught from the spot along with the truck.

They were presented at a press conference yesterday in DMP Media Centre where they admitted to their crime.

Abdus said he was an Imam of a mosque in Faridpur and got involved with the drug trading around two years back. His religious attire and beard helped him dodge the eyes of law enforcers.

Their gang used to bring drugs from the northern districts and sold those to the city peddlers, he added.
