National Immunisation Day Jan 7

The 20th National Immunisation Day (NID) will be observed on January 7 through providing polio vaccine to 24 million children aged upto 5 years.

Health workers and volunteers will administer oral polio vaccine at 1,40,000 sites including in health centres, schools and mobile sites like at transport stations throughout the country, says a press release.

Vitamin-A capsule will also be provided to 20 million children during the programme.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will inaugurate the programme on the first day at her official residence. The second round of the programme will be held on February 11.

Khokon, Maj Mizanur get bail

The High Court yesterday granted two months' anticipatory bail to BNP leaders Khairul Kabir Khokon and Maj (Retd) Mizanur Rahman in separate cases filed on charge on December 18 violence in Dhaka.

The HC bench of Justice Salma Masud Chowdhury and Justice Shahidul Karim granted them bail after hearing separate bail petitions filed by the accused.

Khokon and Mizanur yesterday appeared before the bench, seeking anticipatory bail in the cases

filed with Motijheel and Shahbagh police stations. The cases were filed against them on charges of vandalism and preventing police from discharging their duties on December 18 last year.

Barrister Mahbubuddin Khokon appeared for the accused while Deputy Attorney General Khondker Diliruzzaman represented the government.

DEMOCRATIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE

Japan can be model for S Asia'

A Japanese-disciplined democratic and administrative structure can serve as a model for the South Asian region, observed an international conference in the city yesterday.

The two-day conference styled "Prospects for peace and security through regional cooperation in 21st century South Asia: The role of japan", which concluded yesterday, also observed that the Japanese policy of harmonising the South Asian region can be used to promote stability and development in the region.

Bangladesh Institute of International Strategic Studies (BIISS) with support from Japan Foundation organised the conference at BIISS auditorium in the city marking the 40th anniversary of Establishment of Diplomatic Relations between Bangladesh and Japan.

South Asia and Japan can forge a new relationship, which can put the whole gamut of Asian politics in a positive direction, the programme observed.

Scholars, academics and professionals from Bangladesh, Japan, India, Nepal and Sri Lanka participated in the conference, in which sity can enhance the understanding seven key-note papers were presented covering issues related with the conceptual analysis of regionalism in South Asia, Japan's foreign policy towards Asia in the 21st century, the role of Japan in promoting regional cooperation in South Asia and relation between Japan and the South Asian countries.

The summary proceedings of the conference recommended that trade liberalization, educational cooperation, removal of visa procedure complexities, common food bank and creation of central univer-

and connectivity between the people of South Asia and Japan.

Also, media can be used as an important tool for this, it said.

The conference said Japan's ODA has emphasised on the development of economic infrastructure like hydroelectricity, roads, power transmission stations, etc. whereas the focus of the Japanese help should be more on human development.

Saarc-Japan Special Fund can be used as a tool in alleviating poverty in South Asia, the conference recommended.

Five drown in boat capsize

At least five men drowned and another five reportedly went missing as an overloaded engine-run boat capsized in the river Karnaphuli at Boalkhali upazila yesterday.

They dead were all workers of FMC Corporation Dock Yard. Three people were injured in the accident.

The deceased were identified as Rahamat Ali, 22, of Pachhim Gomdandi; Nayan Miah, 30, of Netrokona; Mohammad Masud, 25, of Netrakona; Emran Hossain of Khulsi, Chittagong; and Abul Kasem, 50, of Pachhim Shakhpura, Boalkhai.

Boalkhali Officer-in-Charge Jahirul Haque Sabuj said the boat carrying some 50 workers of the underconstruction dockyard capsized as it was overloaded. "We suspected that five were missing while the rest people swam ashore safety".

TREE FELLING

HC summons DC of Kurigram, 3 others

The High Court yesterday summoned the deputy commissioner of Kurigram and three others to appear before it on January 8 for not taking action against the persons responsible for cutting down trees on the Bhurungamari High School premises. During the hearing of a writ petition, the court also

issued summons against Bhurungamari Thana Nirbahi

Officer, Officer-in-Charge of Bhurungamari Police Station and the headmaster of Bhurungamari High School to explain why they had not taken action in this regard. Following the petition filed by Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh, the court issued a rule upon them

on December 11 last year to explain why their failure to take action against the people responsible for cutting down the trees should not be declared illegal.

The organisation filed the petition saying that the vested quarters have cut the trees on the school premises and damaged the environment in August 2011.

Enamul Islam Khokon on behalf of the local people had submitted an application to the DC, TNO and OC to take action against the vested quarters but they did not take any action.

The petitioner's counsel Manzill Murshid yesterday told the court that the respondents did not take any action against the persons responsible for cutting down the tress. Rather they now were harassing Khokon in different ways.

The HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Choudhury Manik and Justice Jahangir Hossain Selim issued the summons following the statement of Manzill Murshid, Deputy Attorney General ABM Altaf Hossain said.
