EVMs should be used in all future polls

Comilla polls prove voting machine's effectiveness: CEC

After the success with electronic voting machines in the Comilla City Corporation polls, the Election Commission yesterday strongly advocated for the use of this "safe and user-friendly" device in all polls including the next general elections.

Talking to The Daily star, Chief Election Commissioner ATM Shamsul Huda said, "When the machines are used in all elections, we will be able to stop using tonnes of paper that waste a huge amount of public money. "Dispelling fear and doubt, the electronic voting

machines have proved reliable in the Comilla and Narayanganj polls," the CEC told The Daily Star last night. The BNP-led main opposition has been opposing the use of the machines, saying the devices could be tampered with to rig polls.

Comilla election was the first time when all voters of an election used machines to vote. The commission used 421 machines in 65 polling centres and almost all voters **SEE PAGE 19 COL 4**

Degradation of student politics frustrates youths

Convention of South Asian youths begins in city

Youths at a gathering yesterday expressed frustration over the degradation of moral standards in mainstream and student politics.

Mostly from different educational institutions, they hurled a volley of questions at Awami League Leader Tofail Ahmed on the opening day of LEAD 2012, a convention of South Asian youths.

Their questions related to why politics now failed to inspire and attract the young, what the differences were between student politics of present and past, and why a student did not dream of being prime minister or president anymore.

Hundreds of young people from Saarc countries, the majority being from SEE PAGE 19 COL 8 | Bangladesh, attended the event held at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre in the capital.

Saarc Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SCCI) and Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) organised the two-day convention to motivate youths to be the pioneer of socio-economic change in the region.

Tofail Ahmed, who was upbeat about the glorious days of student politics in the 1960s, pinned the blame for bad politics on the nation's military rulers. He also thought that not holding elections to student unions at universities and colleges was another reason.

Alarming rise in disappearances

Extra-judicial killings declined last year, says rights body Odhikar

While there has been a fall in incidents of extra-judicial killings, the number of 'enforced disappearances' allegedly at the hands of law enforcers saw an alarming rise last year, the rights group Odhikar said yesterday.

Revealing its Human Rights Report 2011, the organisation termed the country's overall human rights situation in 2011 "disappointing", noting that violence on women and journalists had also registered a rise. Odhikar said 30 persons became victims of enforced

disappearances last year while the number was 18 in 2010 and two in 2009.

Only those whose disappearances were linked to members of state-run agencies have been counted. Of the 30 incidents, the Rab was reportedly behind the disappearance of 14 individuals, the police behind 13, including 11 through its Detective Branch, and others were responsible for three others who disappeared.

Releasing the report at Jatiya Press Club yesterday, Odhikar Secretary Adilur Rahman Khan said, "The state might have adopted this tactic [enforced disappearances] due to national and international outcry against extra-judicial killings."
