Woman's head found

Police recovered the head of a woman from under the Alipur Bridge in Keraniganj on the outskirts of the capital last evening.

Mainuddin Khan, officer-in-charge of Keraniganj Police Station, told this correspondent that at around 5:30pm, they recovered the head kept in a polythene shopping bag.

He said they searched for the body in the area but did not get it. Later, they sent the head to the Sir Salimullah Medical College morgue for autopsy.

The morgue sources said the victim might have been killed within 24 hours before the recovery of the head. Her age would be above 30.

Minister finds BRTA office in disarray

Communications Minister Obaidul Quader, in a surprise visit yesterday, detected various anomalies in issuance of driving license, fitness certificate and tax token in the Mirpur office of Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) in the city.

Quader immediately asked BRTA Chairman Ayubur Rahman Khan, who was accompanying him, to take action against the two employees.

He also visited most of the office rooms and expressed dissatisfaction over the overall service standard and cleanliness.

Warning of similar surprise visits to the office in future, he asked the BRTA officials to refrain from engaging in irregularities and to render services to people without any harassment.

"I will not tolerate any irregularities anymore. Stern action will be taken if I find any officials involved in irregularities and harassment of people," he warned.

Absar filed a case with the Uttara Police Station yesterday. As per information of the case, police arrested Sarwar, son of Abdul Khaleq Sarkar from Kashimpur village under Motlab upazila in Chandpur.

Terming the incident as unfortunate, the release of the president's office said there is no link of the president and his relatives with the impostor.

Fire scare at DMCH burn unit

10 patients injured

A fire scare led to the evacuation of over 200 patients of burn unit of Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) yesterday evening.

Ten patients were injured in their attempt to come out of the DMCH burn unit after a smoke and flames were seen in the unit, sparking off the fears. The patients took shelter in a nearby field inside the

DMCH compound and stayed there for five to six minutes until they learnt that the fire had been put out. The rest of the 335 patients stayed inside the hospital as they could not move and did not get help from others.

Patients on the 3rd floor of the six-storey building first noticed the fire at the DMCH burn unit at 5:30pm.

"Soon after noticing the smoke and fire, my wife wasted no time in requesting an unknown man to help her take me out of the hospital," said Abdul Karim, 60, a patient on the 3rd floor of the burn unit.

"Bleeding had started from the burnt parts of my legs and waist as soon as we went out of the hospital," said Karim.

Experts feared that the wounds of the patients who had been evacuated would worsen soon as they were pulled out of the hospital in desperation.

Burn Specialist Dr Samanta Lal Sen said the patients would suffer in the long run as their burnt wounds have been affected once again during the rush.

A Fire Brigade and Civil Defence official said five units had been sent to extinguish the fire but the hospital staff had doused the flame instantly.

The official suspected that the fire broke out from the wastage piled on the rooftop of an overpass connecting the burn unit with the emergency building.
