Noise Pollution City hospital fined

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday fined Square Hospital Ltd Tk 5 lakh for creating sound pollution at Panthapath in the city.

In a drive, a team led by DoE Director (Enforcement) Mohammed Munir Chowdhury found a highvoltage generator producing noise at 65-75 decibels at the hospital around 10:50pm. The environment preser-

vation law declares 100 square metres of space around a hospital as silent zone and limits noise level below 35 decibels in those areas at night.

The Square Hospital authorities were warned twice on October 12 and October 18 last year over the allegation.

Md Yusuf Ali Pradhan, general manager of the hospital, at a hearing yesterday admitted the allegation and promised to stop the generator from the very day.

India launches Tagore web-bibliography

In a boost to students and researchers of Rabindranath Tagore, a web-based bibliography comprising his works and literary criticisms on his works published in India and abroad has been prepared by India's national committee set up to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of the poet.

The bibliography, launched on the web by Finance Minister Pranab Mukherjee, who heads the committee, here on Monday has been undertaken by Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation. The work is a result of the compilation work supervised by

Tagore experts and scholars, involving as many as 20 libraries across the country for titles. The result is that more than 9,000 books in 42 languages, both Indian and foreign, have been located so far. This is, indeed, the most comprehensive attempt under-

taken for compiling the works by, and on, Tagore, or, for that matter, any literary figure. The bibliography is an endeavour to bring a ready reckoner to scholars and readers of Rabindranath Tagore. The finance minister said accessing books on this web-

bibliography has been made easy--a book can be located by its "Title", "Author", "Editor" or "Genre".

A unique feature of the web-portal is its interactive character. Scholars and readers can interact with the site and provide supplementary information about respective publications.

The website (www.rrrlf.gov.in Tagore Bibliography) also provides an interactive platform to enable scholars, experts, and the public the opportunity to improve and expand the bibliography by submitting names of works not yet included.

Human rights of indigenous people grossly violated

Says report

The indigenous people of the country faced gross violation of human rights last year while the perpetrators enjoyed full impunity even after committing crimes like murder, rape, and arson, a report has said. It said the Bangalee people made the

majority of the attacks on the indigenous people in the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) and plain lands in attempts to occupy their lands. At least eight massive communal attacks

were made upon the CHT and plain land indigenous communities and seven Adivasis were killed last year, added the Human Rights Report 2011 on Indigenous People in Bangladesh.

"The indigenous peoples in Bangladesh passed 2011, with countless victims facing gross abuses of human rights without access to justice", it read and added, "The perpetrators, irrespective of state and non-state actors, enjoyed full impunity".

Kapaeeng Foundation (KF), a rights organisation working for the country's indigenous people, prepared the report on the basis of newspaper reports and information from KF activists working different districts. It was released at a programme at National Academy for Planning and Development on Monday.

According to the report, the Bangalee settlers in CHT grabbed 7,118 acres of land

belonging to indigenous people last year. During land-related communal conflicts, at least 111 houses of Jumma villages were burnt down in the CHT and 12 others looted and ransacked, it said.

It further said 11 indigenous women were raped and another five were killed after rape in 2011.

Noted educationist Prof Zillur Rahman Siddiqui said the report could be an eye opener for the overall human rights situation of the indigenous community. "The situation cannot be termed satisfactory", he added.

Mangal Kumar Chakma, an advisor of KF, said the violation of human rights of the Adivasis continues, as the perpetrators stay unpunished. This "culture of impunity" is not only harming the indigenous community, but also the rule of law and democracy of the country, he said.

The report said it is matter of serious concern that thorough investigations are not done into the human rights violations committed by Bangalee settlers with the support of law enforcement agencies in the CHT and by influential land grabbers and criminals with the support of the local administration including police in plain lands.

Kapaeeng Foundation recommended that all the perpetrators be brought to justice and a roadmap be prepared to implement the CHT Accord and solve the land dispute.

Aug 21 Case

Huji leader appeals for discharge

Mohammad Ujjal alias Ratan, a leader of Harkat-ul Jihad al Islami (Huji), appealed to a Dhaka court yesterday, to discharge him from the August 21 grenade attack cases. Ratan, Huji Chief Mufti

Abdul Hannan and nine others, among the 52 accused in the cases, had earlier confessed to the crimes, narrating how and why they had planned assassination of the then prime minister Sheikh Hasina and her party leaders and activists.

The accused submitted the discharge petitions before the Speedy Trial Tribunal-1 when it resumed the hearing on charge framing against the accused, including BNP senior vicechairman Tarique Rahman. Earlier on the day, coun-

sel for Mufti Moinuddin Sheikh alias Abu Zandal completed his submissions in support of discharging his client from the charges. Twenty-four people were

killed and around 200 others injured in the grisly grenade attack on an AL rally at Bangabandhu Avenue on August 21, 2004.

Judge Shahed Nuruddin fixed January 16 for the next hearing.
