Hard wins for top guns

World number one Caroline Wozniacki and her chief rankings rival Petra Kvitova had demanding three-set introductions to the Sydney International in their first official matches of the season on Tuesday. Wozniacki and Kvitova, tuning up for next

week's Australian Open, were on court for more than two hours in warm conditions after beginning their Australian campaigns indoors at last week's Hopman Cup in Perth.

Wozniacki was beaten by world number two Kvitova in three sets in the mixed teams Hopman Cup, after beating American Bethanie Mattek-Sands and Bulgaria's Tsvetana Pironkova in her other singles matches.

After her two hour and 22 minute match against the 18th-ranked Slovakian Dominika Cibulkova, the Danish world number one said her 7-5, 2-6, 6-4 victory had been a tough contest.

Wozniacki set up a quarterfinal clash against Polish seventh seed Agnieszka Radwanska, who overcame Germany's Andrea Petkovic in straight sets.

Wozniacki leads Radwanska 5-1.

On her much-anticipated contest with Kvitova for the top spot, the Dane said she was looking forward to it. Kvitova trails Wozniacki by 295 rankings points with 470 points up for grabs to the winner of the Sydney International.

Kvitova also a had tough fight against Romania's Alexandra Dulgheru, needing two hours and 18 minutes to defeat the world number 66 at the Ken Rosewall Arena.

The powerful left-hander, who became the third Czech woman to win Wimbledon last year, faltered in the heat during the middle set before regaining her form and setting up a quarterfinal with Slovakia's Daniela Hantuchova. Defending champion Li Na also had a

difficult time before subduing South African Chanelle Scheepers 2-6, 6-4, 6-1 to set up a quarterfinal with Lucie Safarova of the Czech Republic. China's world number five Li had prob-

lems with Scheepers' power game before adjusting her tactics to take control. French Open semifinalist Marion Bartoli skated into the quarters with a 6-0, 6-3 win over

Australian Jelena Dokic and will play third seed Victoria Azarenka of Belarus in the last eight.

Azarenka accounted for Serbia's Jelena Jankovic 6-4, 6-2.

Venus out of Aussie Open

Seven-time Grand Slam singles champion Venus Williams withdrew from the Australian Open on Monday as she struggles to return from the autoimmune disease Sjogren's syndrome.

In a posting on her website, the US star said that she has been making progress and plans to return to WTA Tour play in February, when events begin in the United States.

"I regret to announce that I am withdrawing from the 2012 Australian Open," Williams said on her website.

Australian vice-captain Brad Haddin has taken aim at struggling India, saying the tourists "break quicker than anyone in the world" and turn on each other when things are not going their way. Wicketkeeper Haddin turned up the heat on India, trailing 2-0 ahead of Friday's third

Test in Perth, by revealing that Australia had discussed the tourists' mental frailties. India were crushed by an innings and 68 runs in last week's second Test in Sydney

after losing the series opener in Melbourne by 122 runs. Australian captain Michael Clarke scored 329 not out, and Ricky Ponting and Michael Hussey hit centuries as Australia kept the Indians slaving in the field for almost 11 hours

in amassing 659 for four declared in Sydney. "We spoke about a bit of that when we were batting," Haddin was quoted as saying in the Sydney Morning Herald.

"The longer we could keep them out on the field the bigger chance we had of breaking them.

'We know this side can be as fragile as any team in the world if things aren't going their way and they can turn on each other and the media turns on them pretty quick.

"We knew if we could keep them out there and put the numbers like we did on the board we knew we'd get the rewards because they break quicker than anyone in the world."

Fast bowler Ryan Harris, expected to play in Perth for the injured James Pattinson, has also said India were "down and out already" and being torn apart by internal divisions.

Former players and captains have criticised the Indian team's performance with the latest focus on senior batsman V.V.S. Laxman.

Former Indian batsman Sanjay Manjrekar believes Laxman, 37, should be dropped at the WACA ground, allowing for a Test debut for Rohit Sharma in the middle
