Barca set Clasico

A second-string Barcelona set up a King's Cup quarterfinal clash against holders and great rivals Real Madrid when they came back from a goal down to beat Osasuna 2-1 on Thursday for a 6-1 aggregate victory.

Serbian forward Dejan Lekic put the home side ahead just before halftime at a foggy Reyno de Navarra stadium but any hopes of an unlikely comeback were snuffed out by Barca's Chile international Alexis Sanchez when he nodded the equaliser four minutes into the second half.

Teenage B-team midfielder Sergi Roberto grabbed the winner 18 minutes from time when he ran on to a pass from substitute Lionel Messi and crashed a superb angled shot past goalkeeper Asier Riesgo.

Barca, who lost 1-0 to Real in last year's final, travel to the Spanish capital for the first leg on Wednesday, with the return leg at the Nou Camp a week later.

The winners of the tie will meet city rivals Valencia or Levante in the semifinals.

Even more attention than usual will be focused on Real Madrid forward Cristiano Ronaldo when the La Liga leaders play at Real Mallorca on Saturday after his petulant reaction to whistling from disgruntled fans last weekend.

The Portuguese refused to celebrate his goal at the Bernabeu, Real's fifth in a 5-1 thrashing of Granada and his 21st of the campaign, after a section of the home support again expressed their frustration with his performance.

There appears to be a perception among some of the Real faithful that the world's most expensive player can be too selfish and that he is more concerned with personal success than collective triumph.

Coach Jose Mourinho and his team mates have rallied behind Ronaldo and he was given a resounding vote of confidence by honorary Real president Alfredo Di Stefano in the 85-year-old's latest newspaper column published on Thursday.

"We should support him because he could not put in any more effort, he gives everything to the team," Di Stefano wrote in sports daily Marca.

"The Portuguese is an example to follow Bilbao on Sunday.

and his success is the result of a great deal of work," added the former Real player and coach.

Real can stretch their lead over secondplaced Barcelona to eight points with a win in Mallorca, with the champions, who drew 1-1 at local rivals Espanyol last weekend, not playing at home against Real Betis until Sunday.

Barca's form at their Nou Camp arena has been almost impeccable, winning eight and drawing one of their nine games and scoring 39 goals without reply, but they have taken only 13 points from a possible 24 away from home.

Coach Pep Guardiola, whose side are chasing a fourth consecutive La Liga title, said on Wednesday the team's patchy performances on their travels could cost them the league. "Away from home we don't have the

numbers to be champions and we must be more ambitious," he told a news conference ahead of Barca's King's Cup last-16, second leg at Osasuna later on Thursday.

"The reliability we have at home is harder to achieve away but we're ready to fight for the remaining 63 points."

Gibson has signed a fourand-a-half-year contract, Everton said on their website (www.evertonfc.com).

He is Everton's second new recruit since the opening of the January transfer window, following the loan signing of LA Galaxy's Landon Donovan.

Gibson, who has 17 Ireland caps and will be part of the squad for this year's Euro 2012 finals in Poland and Ukraine, could be in line for his debut against Aston Villa on Saturday.

Liverpool captain Steven Gerrard is to stay at Anfield after signing a contract extension with the Premier League club.

Local hero Gerrard, 31, has been a oneclub man throughout his career and the England midfielder told liverpoolfc.tv on Thursday: "I'm very happy. It's a very proud day for myself and my family."

The deal, the terms of which have not been made public, was announced less than a day after Gerrard scored the only goal in the Reds' League Cup semifinal first leg win at Manchester City.

"It comes on the back of a fantastic team performance last night when we got the result we were looking for," Gerrard added. "The contract extension coming the day after has been the icing on the cake so it has been a perfect 24 hours."

His latest goal meant Gerrard has now scored in two of his three appearances since the new year as he looks to put a difficult 2011, where he was sidelined with groin and ankle problems, behind him.

"This is the club I love and is the club I have supported since I was a young boy," Gerrard said. "I am living the dream as the captain of one of the biggest clubs in the world.

Tevez talks abandoned

AC Milan have abandoned talks with Manchester City over the possible transfer of Carlos Tevez following Pato's decision to stay in Italy, Italian news agency Ansa said Thursday.

Milan chief executive Adriano Galliani was holding talks with City and Tevez's agent Kia Joorabchian in London when news filtered through that Pato had turned down a move to Paris Saint Germain.

The decision to walk away from the Tevez negotiations was a direct result of Pato's stance, said Ansa. Earlier, Italian press reported that Galliani had gone to

England to finalise the transfer of the 27-year-old Argentine rebel. French sources also claimed PSG had agreed a deal over a

28-million-euro move for Pato, potentially rising to 35 million euros with bonuses. However, the 22-year-old Brazilian's decision to reject the move to PSG, where he could have rejoined former Milan

coach Carlo Ancelotti, seems to have put a spanner in the Tevez deal's works. The news came in stark contrast to rumours throughout the day, in which even Inter Milan president Massimo

Moratti threw in the towel, saying he thought Tevez would move to the red half of the city. Galliani had travelled to London with lawyer Lorenzo Cantamessa and FIFA agent Giuseppe Riso to meet with City

and Joorabchian. He was expected to make a final offer to City, believed to be based around a loan util the end of the season and then a compulsory sale, with certain conditions attached.

Milan last week claimed to have already reached an agreement with Tevez while City continued to insist they were not interested in letting the Argentine leave on loan.

Inter and PSG are also said to be interested in the former Manchester United star, with both allegedly having tabled offers.

Pato, who is dating Milan owner Silvio Berlusconi's daughter Barbara, added: "Milan is my home, I didn't want to interrupt my career in red and black after having won my first two trophies with this shirt.
