Education in a quagmire

JU appears helpless as politics dictate terms of teachers, students

Jahangirnagar University plunged into further uncertainty as two rival groups of teachers got on a collision course yesterday with one group boycotting classes indefinitely and the other deciding to take classes.

University teachers split into two -- one opposing the vice chancellor and the other backing the VC -- over a set of demands, including the removal of the proctor, following the death of Zubair Ahmed, a fourth-year student of English department, at the hands of Bangladesh

Chhatra League activists on January 9.

The teachers opposing the VC demonstrated on the campus yesterday and gave an ultimatum to the administration for removing the proctor by 12:00 noon tomorrow.

They would go for tougher movement if their demands are not met, said the teachers at a rally on the university campus.

"We will continue boycotting classes and other professional duties until our demands are met," said Dr Sharif Uddin, general secretary of Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association (JUTA).

Govt moves to cut bank borrowing

Spurs ministries on utilising foreign funds

The government may not allow ministries anymore to use local funds as an alternative to foreign funds in a bid to discourage budgetary spending with loans from the banking system, finance ministry officials said yesterday.

If the measure comes into effect, the

ministries will have to keep local and foreign funds separate for any project.

A planning ministry official said the ministries go for the local fund as there are various strings attached to the donor funds.

The government is likely to take the step in line with the conditions of the

Euro crisis deepens

Standard & Poor's has downgraded the credit ratings of nine eurozone countries, stripping France and Austria of their coveted triple-A status but not EU paymaster Germany.

"Today's rating actions are primarily driven by our assessment that the policy initiatives that have been taken by European policymakers in recent weeks may be insufficient to fully address ongoing systemic stresses in the eurozone," the US-based ratings agency said in a statement.

In a potentially more ominous setback, negotiations on a debt swap by private creditors seen as crucial to avert a Greek default that would rock Europe and the world economy broke up without agreement in Athens. Officials, however, said more talks are likely next week.

If Greece cannot persuade banks and insurers to accept voluntary losses on their bond holdings, a second international rescue package for the euro zone's most heavily indebted state will unravel, raising the prospect of bankruptcy in late March, when it has to redeem 14.4 billion euros in maturing debt.

S&P cut the ratings of Italy, Spain, Portugal and Cyprus by two notches and the standings of France, Austria, Malta, Slovakia and Slovenia by one notch each.

The move puts highly indebted Italy on the same BBB+ level as Kazakhstan and pushes Portugal into junk status.

It put 14 euro-zone states on negative outlook for a possible further downgrade, including France, Austria, and still triple-A-rated Finland, the Netherlands and Luxembourg.



Zardari meets Pak army chief amid tensions

Pakistan President Asif Ali Zardari met the chief of the powerful army yesterday for rare face-to-face talks amid a civilian-military standoff that is shaking the government, a spokesman said.

Television reports said the two discussed the memo scandal and issues related to national security.

Sources told DawnNews that the meeting between the army chief and the president lasted for over an hour.

Sources said Kayani told the president that he had reservations over Prime Minister Yousaf Raza Gilani's statements in a Chinese daily regarding the replies submitted by the army chief and DG ISI in the memo case.

The military chief reportedly requested the president to direct the premier to retract his statements made to the
