EC to send letters to parties

BSS, Dhaka

The Election Commission (EC) will send letters to registered political parties to know about their organisational structures across the country.

The EC will inquire whether the organisational structures of the parties that they had showed while taking registration do still exist.

Election Commissioner Sahul Hossain told the news agency that the EC is taking the step to verify the information the parties had supplied to get registration in 2008.

A total of 39 parties got registered with the EC in September 2008. Of those, the registration of Freedom Party was cancelled later. A meeting will be held at the EC Secretariat today to fix a timeline

Cable-TV operator shot

Extortionists shot and injured a cable-TV operator demanding extortion from him at Merajnagar in capital's Kadamtali last night.

The victim, Nannu Molla, owner of Al-Raji Cable Network, was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital with a bullet in his chest.

Ali Azgar, a witness of the incident, told The Daily Star two armed extortionists entered the office of Nannu, 55, which is located on the first floor of Shariatpur Plaza at about 10:00pm.

They sprayed five rounds of bullet targeting Nannu, while three of his friends including Azgar escaped unhurt, he said. Salam, a local extortionist, earlier demanded Tk 2

Malaysian co keen to invest Tk 1,100cr to improve three roads

A Malaysian private company has expressed its interest to invest in both railway and transport sectors in Bangladesh.

Representatives of Gunung Capital, Malaysian property investor and travel and tour company, yesterday met Railway Minister Suranjit Sengupta and Communications Minister Obaidul Quader and expressed their interest.

The eight-member delegation of Gunung Capital headed by its Chairman Dato Syed Abu Hussain is visiting Bangladesh to explore the scope for investment in transport sector.

At a meeting with Quader at his office, the company showed interest to improve three roads at an estimated cost of around Tk 1,100 crore, meeting sources say.

The roads are 49-kilometer next week to discuss modality of its Madanpur-Bhulta-Joydebpur of Dhaka bypass road, 23km Demra-Tongi of Dhaka eastern bypass road and 18km Boliapur-Ruhitpur-Bourovita of Dhaka western bypass road.

Of the budget, about Tk 600 crore will be spent for upgrading the two-lane Madanpur-Bhulta-Joydebpur road into four lanes, Tk 276 crore for widening the narrow

Demra-Tongi road into two lanes and Tk 216 crore for upgrading the Boliapur-Ruhitpur-Bourovita road into four lanes. Another delegation of the com-

Five suspects on fresh remand

Five suspects, who were arrested for their alleged involvement in the killing of six students in Aminbazar, were yesterday remanded again in order for more information to be gathered about the incidents.

They were earlier arrested from different places of Aminbazar and remanded for different periods, but they often kept quiet while they were being quizzed and avoided some questions tactfully even though they were allegedly involved in the killings, CID said.

The arrestees are Farid Khan, Rahim alias 'Hatkata' Rahim, Saiful Islam, Mohammad Wasim and Mohammad Rajib.

The investigation officer, Senior ASP of CID Sirajul Haque, produced the accused before the court of Judicial Magistrate Wasim Sheikh yesterday with a tenday remand prayer for each. The court placed them on a

three-day remand. According to the forwarding reports placed before the court on different dates, the IO said Saiful and Rajib had an important role in the killings while Wasim was found with his bloodstained shirts and trousers after the killings.

Shamsul Islam and Rahim had also important roles in the killings.

Shamam, 17, Ibrahim Khalil, 20, Towhidur Rahman Palash, 22, and Kamruzzaman Kanto, 16, of Government Bangla College in Mirpur; Tipu Sultan, 20, of Tejgaon College; and Sitaf Jabi Munif, 21, of Bangladesh University of Business & Technology were brutally beaten to death on July 18 while their friend Al Amin survived with severe injuries.

Allocate Tk 8000cr to repair roads

JS body asks govt

The parliamentary standing committee on Ministry of Communications yesterday recommended urgent allocation of Tk 8000 crore to repair the country's dilapidated roads before the next monsoon.

The parliamentary watchdog body in its 26th meeting decided to urge the government for ensuring the allocation so that the repair work on roads can be completed before the rainy season.

Communications Minister Obaidul Quader, committee members M Zillul Hakim, Nazrul Islam Manju, HM Golam Reza, Omar Faruk Chowdhury, M Abu Zahir, M Golam Moula Ronny and Apu Ukil attended the meeting with committee chief Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in the chair.

The meeting discussed issues related to division-based allocation of fiscal 2011-2012 under the Roads and Highways Directorate and put emphasis on balanced and consistent allocations for all divisions removing all the discriminations in the next fiscal year.

The meeting finalised the 'Dhaka Transport Coordination Authority Bill' after proper scrutiny, required addition and deduction in the bill.

The bill was prepared to restore discipline in Dhaka city transportation system, making it planned one and modern and to establish Dhaka Transport Coordination Authority by incorporating Dhaka, Narayanganj, Munshiganj, Gazipur and Narsingdi districts.

Fresh probe, speedy trial demanded

Speakers at a rally yesterday demanded the arrest, speedy trial and exemplary punishment of the killers of journalist Manik Chandra Saha.

At the rally organised by "Manik Sahar Suridra" (wellwishers of Manik Saha) in front of the Jatiya Press Club to observe the 8th death anniversary of the journalist, they also demanded a re-investigation of the killing, said a press

release. Khulna correspondent of the Daily New Age and a stringer of BBC Bangla Service, Manik was killed when unidentified miscreants hurled bombs at him on January 15,

in 2004 near Khulna Press Club. The speakers said the killing of Manik was a political plan of the then BNP-Jamaat led government.

Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) Secretary General Mujahidul Islam Selim said although the present government also had blamed the BNP-Jamaat for the murder, it did

not take any steps to try the killers. Journalist Aminur Rasel Babul chaired the rally while President of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury, and General Secretary Abdul Jalil Bhuyian, Dhaka Reporters' Unity Secretary General Sajjad Alam Khan Topu, and CPB leader Ruhin Hossain Prince spoke at the rally.
