Varsity teachers' retirement age extension likely

The government is likely to extend the retirement age of public university teachers from existing 60 to 65 years.

"We have finalised the draft of a law to extend the retirement age and will be sending the bill to the cabinet soon for its approval," Education Secretary Dr Kamal Abdul Naser Chowdhury told The Daily Star, yesterday.

Out of 34 public universities in the country, currently, the retirement age of teachers at 30 public universities is 60

However, teachers of Dhaka University, Chittagong University, Rajshahi University and Jahangirnagar University are serving till 65 years of age, said education ministry officials.

teachers of all public universities," said a deputy secretary of the education ministry wishing not to be named. The education ministry will send a

summary of the draft to the cabinet this week and will later send it to the law ministry for vetting, he said.

According to University Grants

Commission (UGC), there are around 11,000 teachers at public universities, said UGC sources. The teachers have been demanding for

an extension of their retirement age for a four universities. Besides, it would also help remedy the

growing shortage of teachers in the public universities, they said.

The issue came into focus last year when delegations of Federation of Bangladesh University Teachers' Association (FBUTA) and the Association

of Universities of Bangladesh met the prime minister at her office and placed their demand. The prime minister then assured them

that their demand would be met, following "We are formulating the law to ensure long time, as it felt unfair to them to retire which the UGC prepared a proposal and equity among the retirement age of the five years earlier than teachers of the other sent it to the education ministry, said ministry officials. Also, the teachers of Bangladesh

University of Engineering and Technology (Buet) in November last year boycotted class voicing their demands to extend retirement age. The demonstration ended following

assurance from the education minister.

DoE order to remove earth within 30 days

The Department of Environment (DoE) yesterday sent a notice to Unique Properties Ltd asking it to remove the earth the company used to fill 2.65 lakh square feet of Meghna river within 30 days, starting from tomorrow. In a separate drive yesterday, DoE fined and realised Tk

six lakh from Dishari Real Estate Development Ltd for filling up a swamp in the city's Uttarkhan area for an illegal housing project. DoE officials said earth-filling by Unique Properties Ltd on the river near Meghnaghat area in Vatiband and

Char Bhabnathpur mauza is obstructing the river's natural flow. DoE would seize the mentioned earth and auction it if

the company failed to comply with the notice, they added.

On December 23, DoE fined and realised Tk 50 lakh from the company for the earth-filling and asked it to remove the earth. But the company did not comply and appealed to the Ministry of Environment and Forests against the order.

In a hearing on January 12, the ministry directed the company to comply with the DoE order.

On the other hand, Dishari Real Estate Development Ltd was fined after the DoE monitoring and enforcement team led by DoE Director Mohammed Munir Chowdhury conducted a drive in Uttarkhan.

The team also arrested the company's Managing Director Mahbubul Hussain Bhuiyan and stopped the housing project.

A DoE press release said the company earth-filled 50 to 60 bighas of wetland, used by the locals to cultivate boro rice during the winter and for fish cultivation, for the housing project. The locals said the wetland, locally known as Sinedy

canal, is connected to Noligang canal which merges with the Balu river and earth-filling could inundate the surrounding areas during the monsoon.

Fish fry production drops in Halda, say experts

Over the last six decades, the production of fish fry in the country's largest natural fish spawning ground - Halda river - has drastically decreased due to causes both man-made and natural, said experts at a seminar yesterday.

The production dropped all the way from 2,470kg in 1945 to 234kg in 2011, showed statistics presented by Chittagong University zoology department Prof Dr Mohammad Ali Azadi.

The experts said five oxbow-bends, spawning grounds for fishes, in the river were also lost in the period 1928-2002 due to loop cutting by the locals.

As a result, fishes have been spawning in scatter since 2004 causing a loss in fish production, they added.

Department of Fisheries (DoF) organised the daylong seminar styled 'Restoration, enrichment and preservation of the natural spawning ground of the river Halda' in the city's CIRDAP auditorium.

In his keynote presentation, Prof Azadi showed that sluice gates, set on the river for irrigation and flood control at different periods, have blocked 13 out of 16 tributaries of Halda that fell within its 20 km spawning area.

Consequently, the water flow here dropped, blocking fish and egg move-

ment, and the depth reduced due to sedimentation, he said adding that, "Loop cutting should be banned and unused sluice gates should be removed."

The production of fishes like Kalibaush, Rui and Mrigal has dropped drastically due to excessive capture of Kalibaush and Rui illegally by angling, he said.

Thus, selective stocking programme for each fish species should be adopted to increase the production of carps, he suggested.

DoF took up a Tk 13.21 crore project to conserve the natural spawning ground of Halda river in 2007-08 that has been expanded till 2013. Prof Dr Mukhlesur Rahman Khan of

Department of Fisheries Biology and Genetics of Bangladesh Agriculture University recommended stopping selling of sand from Halda river bed, irrigation in Halda basin, catching of brood fish and discharge of industrial effluents into the river.

He also called for banning fishing in the migration routes during the spawning seasons to restore the river's natural breeding ground.

Earlier, Fisheries and Livestock Minister Abdul Latif Biswas and DoF Director General Syed Arif Azad, addressed the seminar among others.


