--Increasing the price of tickets is not a popular way to curb the loss of the railway. If the black marketing of the railway tickets can be brought down to a sustainable level, the Bangladesh Railway will become a profitable organisation.

This killing has sharpened an international confrontation over Iran's nuclear programme in which threats and counter-threats are being increasingly backed by dis-


