Man attacks
in-law's family
for second
marriage denial
Five injured

A man and his family yesterday beat up five persons, including his wife and in-laws, after being denied permission for a second marriage at Laxmirdar village in Atwary upazila.

Saifun Nahar, 22, wife of M. O. M. A. R. U. I. S. I. A. M. Chutumai, 45, aunt of Saifun; and Mokbular Rahman, 38, her uncle; were admitted to Boda Upazila Health Complex.

The injured others are Balarampur UP member Pulin Chandra Barman, 55, and Saifun's another uncle Osman Ali.

Saifun Nahar, daughter of Md. Shamsuzzoha of Shahapara village, was married to Mozaharul Islam alias Gando of Laxirdar village seven years before.

For the last two years, Mozahar now and then tortured Saifun for getting her permission to marry another woman.

Yesterday, Saifun's family members and relatives went to Mozahar's house to settle the matter.

At one stage, Mozahar and his family members attacked Saifun's family, leaving five persons, including the UP member, injured.

Saifun's father said he was taking preparation for a case with Boda Police Station.

COUP ATTEMPT FOILED Army's role hailed

Railways Minister Suranji Sengupta yesterday congratulated the government and Bangladesh Army for making public the facts behind a foiled coup attempt.

"Many coup attempts were foiled in the history of Bangladesh. But no government ever showed this much courage to disclose it."

"By disclosing the facts of the recent coup attempt, the government created a new history," he commented.

Addressing as chief guest a discussion at Jatiya Press Club in the city, Suranji said, "The government again proved that people are the ultimate source of power in a democratic society and they (people) should be informed of every incident."

Bangabandhu Academy organised the discussion marking Shaheed Asad Day, the 43rd death anniversary of Asaduzzaman who died in 1969 after Pakistan's security forces fired into a protest march he was leading on Dhaka's streets.

Suranji, also an advisory council member of the ruling Awami League, said as the war

crimes trial gains momentum, an ongoing conspiracy to overthrow the democratic government intensifies.

Today the country is divided into two parts, one loyal to the spirit of the War of Liberation and the other to the defeated forces of the War of Liberation. This division is being reflected in every sector of the administration, he added.

Suranji termed Leader of the Opposition in Parliament and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's recent remark that army officers are disappearing as a "provocative statement".

The veteran AL leader called on the country's progressive forces and countrymen to unite against all forms of conspiracy against the war crimes trial.

Suranji also criticised some members of Indian Border Security Force (BSF) for torturing a Bangladeshi youth in the border. "Such attitude by the border force (BSF) is intolerable."

Workers Party of Bangladesh President Rashed Khan Menon, who also congratulated Bangladesh Army, said a vested quarter is always active in disrupting democracy in Bangladesh.

Jubo Dal vandalises BNP office

A group of leaders and activists of Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal, denied posts in the newly formed committee of the organisation, vandalised the district unit office of BNP Thursday night.

The central committee of Jubo Dal declared the new committee of Tangail district unit on Thursday, naming Ahmedul Haque Shatil as president, Ashraf Paheli as general secretary, and Shafiqul Islam Swapan as organising secretary, party sources said.

2 die as trains hit them in Sirajganj

A youth was killed after being hit by a train in sadar upazila of the district yesterday.

The victim is Royal Talukder, 30, son of Belal Hossain of Pashchim Pargachha village in Natore.

Sirajganj GRP Station ASI Mofiz Uddin said a Rajshahi-bound intercity train from Dhaka hit Royal and ran him over at Saydabad at about 9:00am while he was crossing the rail tracks.

In another incident, a youth died instantly as he was run over by a Dhaka-bound intercity train, Lalmoni Express, at Jamtoil Station in sadar upazila when he fell on the rail tracks at about 2:00am, police said.

The deceased Inamul Haque, 22, is the son of Anowar Hossain of Baraigram village in the district.
