



## Turkish comedy-drama Kagit receives top award 12th Dhaka Int'l Film Fest ends

Both the Bangladeshi entries -- "Guerrilla" and "Moner Manush" -- bagged awards and Turkish filmmaker Sinan Cetin received the Best Director Award for his comedy-drama "Kagit" (Paper), at the Dhaka International Film Festival 2012.

The festival concluded yesterday on a high note. Oner Erkan received the Best Actor Award for his performance in "Kagit", playing a young filmmaker who has set all his aspirations on his debut project.

The award giving and concluding ceremony took place at the Main Auditorium of the National Museum in Dhaka.


Joya Ahsan won the Best Actress Award for her moving performance in Nasiruddin Youssuf's Liberation War saga, "Guerrilla". Indian filmmaker Goutam Ghosh received the Best Cinematographer Award for the Bangladesh-India joint production, "Moner Manush".
