## Two more children die of Nipah

Two children suspected to have contracted Nipah virus died yesterday in Joypurhat in suspected infections of Nipah virus.

They are eight-year-old Touhidul Islam, son of Anwar Hossain at Dadra-Jointigram in Joypurhat sadar upazila, and six-yearold Marium, daughter of Jahangir Mondol in

Sardarpara of Joypurhat. Family members of both the victims said they had fallen sick after drinking date juice collected from the same tree.

Ali Naoroz, head of children unit-3 at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, said a team of Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research (IEDCR) on Saturday collected samples from the children to confirm the disease.

Marium was admitted to the hospital on Friday while Fouhid on Saturday, reports our Rajshahi correspondent.

Quoting Joypurhat Civil Surgeon Mozammel Haque our Dinajpur correspondent said three children died in last 48 hours probably from Nipah infection.

Another child, Anik, died at Ziaur Rahman Medical College Hospital in Bogra on Thursday.

AUTOPSY OF MEGHNA'S BODY

ROADS ON TITAS RIVER Govt asked to explain in four weeks

The High Court yesterday issued a rule upon the government to explain in four weeks why construction of several makeshift roads in the name of embankments on the river Titas in Brahmanbaria should not be declared illegal.

In response to a writ petition, the court asked the government to explain why it should not be directed to demolish or remove the roads to ensure a natural flow of water of the river. The HC bench of Justice

Farid Ahmed and Justice Sheikh Hassan Arif came up with the rule after hearing the writ petition filed to challenge the legality of the construction of "makeshift roads in the name of embankments" on the river. Mahmudur Rahman,

acting editor of the daily Amar Desh, filed the petition as public interest litigation on January 12, stating that several makeshift roads and 17 rivulets were erected in the name of embankments in different areas in Brahmanbaria, thereby obstructing the natural water flow of the river.

The roads and embankments were erected on the river violating the provisions of Bangladesh Water Development Act of 2000, Embankment Act of 1953 and Inland Transport Authority Ordinance 1958, which ensured a free flow of water, the petitioner said.

Petitioner's counsel AJ Mohammad Ali told the court that roads and embankments were constructed on the river Titas, obstructing the free flow of water and damaging the environment of the area.

Additional Attorney General MK Rahman and Deputy Attorney General Motaher Hossain Saju opposed the petition, saying that roads and embankments were constructed following the relevant laws and rules.

MK Rahman told The Daily Star that the petitioner, a BNP leader and a former energy adviser of the BNP-led fourparty alliance government, did not mention the period when the roads and embankments were constructed and did not also move the petition during the construction period.

Paying homage to Barrister Salma Sobhan, Justice KM Sobhan and Advocate Aminul Haque, speakers yesterday at a memorial programme said that they had made great contributions to today's democracy.

The eminent personalities were the founding members of the legal aid and human rights organisation Ain o Salish Kendra (ASK).

The speakers at the programme reflected on their colourful lives and heroic deeds at intervals of singing and poem recitations.

ASK organised the memorial meeting with a cultural programme at the Chhayanaut auditorium in the city yesterday evening. They did not have greed for designations which is rare

and also difficult to follow by others, they said. Their relentless work to ensure human rights brought them fame not only in the country but also abroad, they added.

The speakers said that these individuals also led a movement against communalism and to ensure trial of war criminals.

Salma Sobhan founded ASK in 1986 to make deprived women in the country aware of their rights. She breathed her last on December 30, 2003.

director of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) for not taking any step for conducting post mortem of the body of Nusrat Jahan Meghna, a student of Uttara University, as per its directive.

During hearing a writ petition, the court directed Brigadier General Mostafizur Rahman, director of DMCH, to appear before it by 10:30am today to explain the matter. Petitioner's counsel Manzill Murshid told the

court that the body of Nusrat Jahan Meghna was exhumed and then brought to DMCH morgue on January 19 as per its January 18 directives.

The DMCH authorities did not conduct the post mortem of the body in last three days, although her relatives requested its director to conductit, he said.

Manzill said that the DMCH director did not

take any step rather advised the relatives of Meghna to approach the forensic department of the hospital for having the post mortem, which is a similar to violation of the court order.

The HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Choudhury Manik and Justice Jahangir Hossain Selim yesterday passed the order after a hearing.

The court on January 18 responding to the writ petition directed the DMCH director to form a three-member committee to conduct further post-mortem of the body and submit report to it as early as possible.

Phulbanu, Meghna's mother, on January 17 filed the writ petition claiming that her daughter was tortured and murdered at her husband's house on January 5.

The doctors of Gazipur hospital also gave a "false" post-mortem report of Meghna, she

said seeking directives from the HC to exhume Meghna's body for further examination.

# Bangladesh military contingent awarded in South Sudan

Force Comd, UNMISS, Maj Gen Moses Obi awarded "Force Commander's Unit Citation" to Bangladesh Military Police (BANMP/6) as a recognition of its outstanding professional competence in South Sudan, an official release said yesterday.

The Bangladesh Military Police Contingent was inducted into the United Nations Mission in Sudan (UNMIS) in November 2010 and was deployed within all the sectors of the mission.
