Mario Balotelli settled an extraordinary Premier League battle when his 94th minute penalty earned leaders Manchester City a 3-

2 victory over Tottenham here Sunday.

The Italian substitute won the spot kick himself, after a clear foul by the veteran Spurs defender Ledley King, and calmly wrongfooted goalkeeper Brad Friedel as he converted into the bottom left-hand corner.

To make matters worse for Spurs, who now trail City by eight points, seconds earlier they had looked like scoring a winner of their own. Gareth Bale sprinted away from the home

defence and crossed for Jermain Defoe who, at full stretch, could only turn the ball wide of the target.

And the deciding goal capped a remarkable second half which

featured four goals in nine minutes Samir Nasri and Joleon Lescott for the home team before

Defoe and Bale brought Spurs level.

After 55 minutes, David Silva collected the ball just inside the Spurs half and suddenly found the necessary space to advance and thread through a pass for Nasri to convert an unstoppable first-time shot from just inside the area.

Within minutes, Silva had won a corner, taken on the left by Nasri and flicked on by Edin Dzeko at the near post.

The ball was met by Lescott who tussled with Scott Parker and converted into an open goal in the process of falling over.

A long clearance from Younes Kaboul on the hour forced centre half Stefan Savic into a disastrous backwards header which was intercepted by Defoe who controlled the ball on his chest as he rounded Joe Hart and rolled the ball into an empty goal.

It took all of four more minutes for Spurs to draw level as Aaron Lennon ran at Micah Richards before squaring to the unmarked Bale who placed a magnificent 22-yard, leftfoot shot over Hart and into the top righthand corner of the City goal.

It was a stunning sequence of events after a disappointing first half. The stakes, and the tension, were high in the opening exchanges with Bale, operating on both flanks in the first half, appearing capable of creating problems.

In the second half, City threatened from a series of corners before a 25-yarder from Luka Modric drifted over, Gael Clichy was forced to head over with Lennon about to connect with a Bale cross.

Lowly Equatorial Guinea stunned Libya and Zambia upset Senegal as the African Nations Cup began with surprises as well as tear gas outside the stadium in Bata on Saturday.

Co-hosts Equatorial Guinea, whose starting line-up consisted entirely of players born abroad, beat Libya 1-0 thanks to a late strike by former Real Madrid player Javier Balboa in the first-

half of a double bill. Zambia then scored twice in the first quarter of the game on their way to a 2-1 win over Senegal, back in the tournament after astonishingly missing out in 2010.

The tournament is already without defending champions Egypt, Nigeria, Cameroon and South Africa, who all failed to qualify.

Off the field, it was a less happy day for Equatorial Guinea, sharing the tournament with Gabon, as police used tear gas against fans trying to get into the ground.

firing tear gas to control supporters who apparently became impatient at delays getting into the stadium. There were no reports of injuries.

There was further embarrassment when most of the crowd left after Equatorial Guinea's match, leaving Zambia and Senegal to play in a half-empty

Organisers will be hoping for less trouble on Sunday when Ivory Coast meet Sudan and Burkina Faso play Angola in the capital Malabo in Group B.

The first match kicked off seven minutes late following the opening ceremony and a speech by President Teodoro Nguema Obiang Mbasogo, which lasted several minutes with the teams lined up and ready for kicked off.

Japan winger Shinji Kagawa has said he sees his future being with German champions Borussia Dortmund and any reports of a move to European giants Manchester United or AC Milan are just speculation.

"Right now, it's just about me being successful here with Dortmund," Kagawa told German newspaper Die Welt on Sunday having been linked to both European teams in the German and Japanese media in recent months.

"There are rumours (about Manchester United or AC Milan) again and again, but I have no information about that. The talk leaves me cold."

The 22-year-old joined Dortmund in 2010 from Japan side Cerezo Osaka for just 350,000 euros, but after helping Dortmund win the German title last season, his market value has soared to around 14 million euros.

He has a contract at Dortmund until 2013 and is back in form after missing the first few months of 2011 after breaking his foot while playing for Japan at the Asian Cup last January.

Striker Fabio Borini grabbed the third in the ninth minute as Roma went on the rampage.



Chelsea were held and Newcastle United and Liverpool humbled on a day of surprises in the Premier League

on Saturday when the lesser lights enjoyed some unexpected success against the more established teams.

Chelsea drew 0-0 at Norwich City, Newcastle crashed 5-2 at Fulham and Liverpool, who had beaten Bolton Wanderers in their last 10 league meetings over the past five years, lost 3-1 at the Reebok Stadium as the home side climbed out of the bottom three for the first time since mid-September.

There was also a notable win for Queens Park Rangers, who moved out of the relegation zone after beating bottom side Wigan Athletic 3-1 to record their first league win in 10 games and their first three points

under new coach Mark Hughes.

With four of the top five not playing until Sunday - when leaders Manchester City host third-placed Tottenham Hotspur and secondplaced Manchester United visit fifth-placed Arsenal - Chelsea had a chance to close the gap but missed out at Norwich.

The west London side remain fourth, five points behind Harry Redknapp's high-flying Tottenham team.

Chelsea coach Andre Villas-Boas said his side did not do well enough at Norwich despite dominating much of the game as they were thwarted by a fine goalkeeping display by John Ruddy.

Chelsea's Spain striker Fernando Torres, their 50 million pounds signing from Liverpool a year ago, failed to find the net for the 17th successive match for club and country.
