Nizami also talked to the highest authority of the government about the arms haul, he said.

Why duty-free car for MPs?

NHRC boss questions the privilege

NBR to use EC's database of voters

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) yesterday struck a deal with the Election Commission to utilise the voters' online database for verifying information before awarding tax identification number.

The deal will help stop people from obtaining fake TIN using fake names and addresses and generate more tax revenues to some extent, officials observed.

Mohasin Ali, a director of the EC, and AKM Badiul Alam, first secretary (Tax) of NBR, signed the memorandum of understanding at the EC conference room in the capital.

"When anyone applies for a TIN, the NBR cannot be certain about their identity only from the submitted papers. So, we seek a photocopy of their national ID,' said Alam.

Aggreko to run its power plant on gas

Deal signed on conversion STAR REPORT


The government yesterday signed an amendment of an existing contract with a British rental power company Aggreko to convert its 145-megawatt dieselfired power plant into a gas-fired one.

This conversion would help the government save around Tk 1,100 crore to 1,200 crore a year by not importing diesel for the plant at Ghorashal that started operation in August, 2010.

Although there is severe gas crisis, the Power Development Board (PDB) is getting 30 to 34 million cubic feet of gas per day for Aggreko from its reserved allocation.

Sources said, the PDB has several gas-based power plants in Ghorashal, but some of them have gone out of order in recent years. The gas allocated for these plants remains unutilised. As the PDB was facing

Train torched after robbery

About 200 passengers robbed of valuables

Passengers incensed by robbery in a local train set fire to its two compartments at Shambhuganj Railway Station in sadar upazila Tuesday night.

A group of robbers swooped on a Mymensigh-bound train, Jaria 275 Local, from Jaria of Netrakona when it reached Gouripur outer signal at 9:00pm, said Abul Kalam Azad, station master of Mymensigh Railway Station.

They looted cash and valuables from some 200 passengers in a compartment and got off the train when it slowed down before entering Shambhuganj Railway Station, Azad said.

The robbers injured at least 10 people while taking away their belongings. Some other passengers were hurt when they jumped off the running train to escape from the robbers, local people said.

As the train reached Shambhuganj Railway Station around 10:15pm, angry passengers torched two compartments. One compartment was damaged completely while the other partially, Azad said.

IMF warns of recession

Lowers world growth forecast to 3.3pc

Europe's debt crisis could tip the world economy into recession and a bigger firewall is urgently needed to keep the damage from spreading, the International Monetary Fund said on Tuesday.

The IMF chopped its estimate for 2012 global growth to 3.3 percent

from 4 percent just three months ago and warned it could drop as low as 1.3 percent if Europe lets the crisis fester for much longer. For 2013, it predicted growth of 3.9 percent.

"The epicentre of the danger is Europe but the rest of the world is increasingly affected," IMF chief economist Olivier Blanchard said at a news conference. "There is an even

greater danger, namely that the European crisis intensifies, and in this case the world could be plunged into another recession."

"With the right set of measures, the worst can definitively be avoided and the recovery can be put back on track," he said. "These measures can be taken, need to be taken, and need SEE PAGE 6 COL 1
