#### 12 'parties' warn govt against war crimes trial

"Twelve Islamic and likeminded parties" yesterday said if the ongoing war crimes trial was not stopped, they would try "India's agents" after the end of Awami League rule in the country.

They warned that the government must meet their demands within 30 days, or they would go for tough agitation programmes such as

hartal and blockades.

The demands include putting an end to the war crimes trial, keeping the words "Absolute faith and trust in the almighty Allah" in the preamble to the constitution, scrapping the women development policy and stopping conspiracy against Islam".

The leaders were speaking at the national convention of 12 Islamic and like-minded parties at the Jatiya Press Club in the capital.

# Govt slaps ban, BNP shifts date

Opposition defers mass procession plan to tomorrow, says it is showing tolerance; AL postpones rally

The BNP last night rescheduled today's mass procession in Dhaka for tomorrow.

The decision came after a daylong drama followed by a police ban on rallies and processions in the capital and four other cities today amid fears of a deterioration in law and order.

"Showing tolerance, we deferred our programme for a day. We will hold it on

Monday [tomorrow]. We will go for fresh programmes if the government obstructs our Monday programme," acting BNP secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir told reporters on emerging from an emergency meeting of the party's standing committee.

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia presided over the meeting at her Gulshan office in the capital.

The Awami League has also postponed its rally today in the capital following the imposition of the ban.

"We have postponed our rally out of respect for the law. We will sit soon to decide our next course of action," said Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya, general secretary of AL Dhaka city unit.

Meanwhile, police have imposed a ban on public gatherings in the metropolitan areas of Chittagong, Khulna, Rajshahi and Sylhet.

On January 9, Khaleda Zia at a Chittagong rally declared countrywide mass procession programmes for today and a rally in Dhaka on March 12 to apply pressure on the government for a restoration of the caretaker government system. The BNP chairperson was scheduled to

lead a procession today from the BNP's Naya Paltan office in the capital.

More than two weeks after her announcement, the AL city unit on Thursday declared that it would hold a

#### TRANSIT, TRADE India wants renewal of protocol

Considers hiking fee

India will seek extension of its Trade and Transit Protocol with Bangladesh beyond March this year.

The Ministry of External Affairs will try to extend the timeframe when it comes for renewal to provide longer certainty to vessel operators, a statement issued by the Indian Prime Minister's Office said yesterday.

It said India's shipping ministry has been asked to consider providing additional money to ensure navigation facilities on India-Bangladesh waterways route at night times.

Efforts would also be made for the early completion of Ashuganj multimodal port by Bangladesh and its regular use as a transit port, the statement added.

The decisions were taken recently at a meeting presided by Pulok Chatterjee, the Indian prime minister's principal secretary.

## Niko paid bribe for Bapex deal

Mamun got \$10,000 to win Hawa Bhaban nod

A Canadian magazine revealed last August that Niko, a company of that country, had paid half a million dollars to Hawa Bhaban men to get a controversial joint venture deal with Bangladesh Petroleum **Exploration & Production Company** Limited (Bapex) in 2003.

Hawa Bhaban used to be the political office of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia who was also the prime minister back then, but it doubled as an alternative power centre revolving around her elder son Tarique Rahman. One of Tarique's

close friends is Giasuddin Al Mamun, who became quite influential and wealthy during the last BNP-led regime.

The ROB Magazine -- a supplement of one of the leading Canadian dailies Globe & Mail -- quoting Canadian police records of Mamun's statements, said initially Niko offered him a retainer of US\$10,000 to make the deal successful.

But Mamun ultimately failed to make the deal happen on his own. The report "Niko Resources: Ottawa's corruption test case" by reporter Greg McArthur, published on August 26, 2011 states, "As a

northern city yesterday over the legislator's "demand" for jobs for his men.


Five truckload of stick-wielding Jatiya Party activists led by lawmaker Hossain Mokbul Shahriar Asif, nephew of JP chief HM

This did not go well with the employees of the hospital and


