José Mourinho is to leave Real Madrid at the end of the season in order to take up a new job in the Premier League, it has been reported.

Speculation over Mourinho's future in Spain has increased in recent weeks following a series of public rows, amid suggestions that he is being undermined from within the club despite their impressive form. Real's 3-1 win over Real Zaragoza on Saturday was their 17th league victory from 20 games, keeping them top of La Liga on 52 points.

A source close to Mourinho told the Sunday Times that the coach had become exasperated by life at the club. "José is sick and tired of this situation at Madrid. It doesn't matter if he wins this season or not. It's not about the money. He's decided to come back to England and he will go in the summer."

The 49-year-old, who earns a net salary of £8.4m at Madrid, has previously been linked with both Manchester clubs, while Chelsea's relative struggles have raised doubts over André Villas-Boas's long-term future. Arsène Wenger's situation at Arsenal, and the Tottenham manager Harry Redknapp's links to the England job, also raise the possibility of high-profile Premier League vacancies at the end of the season.

The result makes it fifteen wins in sixteen league games, the home defeat to Barcelona in December being the only blip, for a Madrid side showing great consistency in the league.

Liverpool knocked Manchester United out of the FA Cup but were put on the defensive when the question of racism again raised its head at Anfield. An image of a Liverpool fan appearing to make an offensive monkey gesture was circulated on Twitter, prompting Merseyside police to make an arrest.

Patrice Evra, who became embroiled in the row that led to Luis Suárez being found guilty of racially abusing the United defender in the 11 draw on 15 October, was booed loudly every time he touched the ball during the Cup tie, which Liverpoolwon21.

Merseyside police said in a statement: "We can confirm that a 59-year-old man from North Wales has been arrested following an alleged incident. The man has been taken to a police station and will be questioned by officers. Merseyside Police would like to thank North Wales Police and Liverpool Football Club for their assistance with this matter."

When Kenny Dalglish was asked what he thought of Evra's every touch being booed, the Liverpool manager responded: "Are you winding me up?" He added: "Why would I be disappointed for Evra? I can't believe you have asked that question before anything else. Have you ever played football? I used to get booed."

Bayern Munich stayed top of the German league on Saturday as Mario Gomez claimed his 17th goal of the season in a 2-0 win over Wolfsburg, but

Borussia Dortmund and Schalke are both hard on their heels. Japan winger Shinji Kagawa scored

twice in Dortmund's 3-1 win over Hoffenheim, while Schalke's 4-1 win at Cologne means there is a three-way tie with Dortmund, Schalke and Bayern on 40 points. Munich stay top by virtue of a supe-

rior goal difference.

Germany striker Gomez has now scored 17 goals in 18 league games this season, as Bayern bounced back from their shock 3-1 defeat at Borussia Moenchengladbach with a win over

The 26-year-old fired home at Munich's Allianz Arena with an hour on the clock after France winger Franck Ribery was fouled and Gomez converted a free-kick from Germany team-mate Toni Kroos.

Dutch winger Arjen Robben added Bayern's second in the 92nd minute when the ball went in off his stomach after a lob from Croatia striker Ivica Olic. "We had good chances in the first

half, but we didn't take them," said Bayern coach Jupp Heynckes.

"This time, we had the luck and the ability to take the lead through a setpiece. In terms of our scoring chances and the way we played, the win was deserved."

Dortmund ahead after just 16 minutes before Grosskreutz slotted home the hosts' second after 31 minutes.

The pair then combined for the stunning third goal, when a crisp back-heel from Grosskreutz fell into Kagawa's path and he fired home from close range on 55 minutes.

USA defender Fabian Johnson scored a 63rd-minute consolation for Hoffenheim, but it was too little, too late.

"We were very strong in the opening phase, but didn't convert all our goal chances," said Dortmund coach Jurgen Klopp.

"In the second half, we saw what could have happened if we hadn't put in so much work in the first half (as Hoffenheim came back). It was an excellent home game."

Schalke came from behind to record a 4-1 win at 10-man Cologne to stay third after Germany striker Lukas Podolski gave the hosts an early lead.

The Royal Blues got back in the game when Romanian striker Ciprian Marica netted with headers on 60 and 72 minutes.

Cologne's problems were compounded when defender Miso Brecko was sent off for fouling Schalke's Julian Draxler in the area and Klaas-Jan Huntelaar netted the penalty on 78 minutes.

Midfielder Marco Hoeger completed the rout with a late strike to claim Schalke's fifth straight league win.

Manchester City refused an offer from Liverpool that would have seen unsettled Argentinian forward Carlos Tevez move to Anfield in a straight swap for misfiring Reds striker Andy Carroll, reports said Sunday.

According to two newspaper reports Liverpool were prepared to suffer a loss of around £10 million on Carroll if City agreed the swap deal.

Carroll cost Liverpool a club record £35 million when he moved to Anfield from Newcastle last season, in the process becoming the eighth most expensive footballer in history.

But while prolific with the Magpies, Carroll has scored only six goals in 36 appearances and failed to secure a regular starting spot in Kenny Dalglish's side.

The career of Tevez has been in limbo since a touchline bust-up with manager Roberto Mancini during the Champions League defeat Bayern Munich in September, when he refused to come on as a substitute.

The Argentinian, who was hit with a £1.2 million fine by City in December for going to Argentina without permission, has been trying to seal a transfer in recent weeks but touted moves to AC Milan, Inter Milan and Paris St Germain have all came to nothing.

Fergie backs De Gea

Matri's winner just after the hour mark owed much to an inspired substitution by Conte, who sent on Claudio Marchisio for ex-Udinese favourite Fabio Quagliarella.

Marchisio promptly diverted an Arturo Vidal cross right into Matri's path and the striker lashed the ball past visiting goal-

keeper Samir Handanovic to

clinch a crucial win. Matri had notched his opener from point-blank range after Handanovic had palmed out a near-post

Lazio receive Honda boost

Japan and CSKA Moscow midfielder Keisuke Honda, the 2011 Asian Cup's most valuable player, is to join Serie A side Lazio in a 14-million-euro transfer, a Japanese sports daily reported Sunday.

CSKA and Lazio have narrowed their differences and come to terms on the transfer fee -- worth \$18.5 million -after the 25-year-old Honda agreed other terms with the Rome outfit, the Sports Nippon said.

Following the club-to-club agreement, Honda lunched with Lazio president Claudio Lotito in Rome after flying in from Barcelona, where he was undergoing rehabilitation on his injured right knee, the daily said.

He is expected to undergo a medical at Lazio, possibly on Sunday, and his transfer will be formally announced as soon as the Italian side's quota on non-European Union players is vacated to allow Honda, the Sports Nippon said. Several major English clubs including Liverpool, Arsenal

Honda during the Asian Cup in January last year when Japan won a record fourth continental title. In June, Juventus reportedly held talks with CSKA Moscow over the midfielder, who was also linked with Paris Saint-

and Aston Villa were reported to have shown an interest in

Germain earlier in the month. After four years at J-League powerhouse Nagoya Grampus and two years at Dutch club VVV Venlo, Honda joined CSKA in January 2010 and became the first Japanese player

to reach the quarter-finals of the Champions League. He was the driving force behind the Blue Samurai when they reached the last 16 at the 2010 World Cup in South Africa.
