Two hours of hitting from Ziaur Rahman ensured Old DOHS a major slay in their championship pursuit of the Dhaka Premier League yesterday.

The league leaders beat Abahani by eight runs at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium, taking them to 16 points from nine games -- two ahead of Victoria Sporting Club and four better than the defending champions.

Gazi Tank too kept themselves in the hunt through a fine 50-run win over Mohammedan Sporting Club while Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club brushed past Bangladesh Biman by 39 runs.



Big-hitting Zia took an instant liking to the Abahani bowlers, especially the seamers as he went about taking them apart in his 91 that helped Old DOHS to 257 all out in 50 overs.

He smashed Elias Sunny in the fourth over before cracking Abul Hasan for two sixes and another one off Peter Trego. Apart from the sixes, Zia hit ten boundaries in his 93-ball whirlwind before falling to Saqlain Sajib in the 31st over.

Zia and Rameez Aziz added 107 for the second wicket with the left-handed Pakistani scoring 42 off 57 balls.

Both batsmen fell in quick succession with Abahani threatening to come back but Adnan Reza (41) and Nurul Hasan (28 not out) took them past the 250-mark. Trego took three expensive wickets in his ten

overs while Sunny picked up two.

Abahani made a disastrous start, losing openers Anamul Haque and Fazle Rabbi as well as one-down Trego for 58 runs. After Marshall Ayub was run out by Faisal Hossain, skipper Mahmudullah Riyad and Mithun Manhas staged yet another fightback.

The pair added 136 runs for the fifth wicket but both fell in the space of ten balls. Abahani needed 44 off the last five overs but it became 32 off twelve balls after three good overs from Enamul Haque, Jalat Khan and Mohammad Ashraful. Nabil Samad then got smashed for 17 in the penultimate over with

Hasan hammering him for a six. Shuvogoto Hom Chowdhury however pulled it back for Old DOHS, conceding seven and picking up a wicket in the final over.

Bangladesh Under-19 is now leading the series 3-2 and will play the sixth match at the same venue today.

Man-of-the-match Brett Hutton guided the visitors to the comfortable victory, ripping through the home side's top order by taking three wickets. Bangladesh Under-19 lost wickets at regular intervals to be bundled out for 167 runs chasing 196. Number seven batsman Zakaria Masud was not out on 38 off 60 deliveries with three boundaries.

## Tamim in IPL auction

Tamim Iqbal is the only Bangladeshi cricketer to make it to the final list of the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2012 auction when the preliminary list was curtailed to a 144-player final list yesterday.

Earlier, Bangladesh Cricket Board had submitted a list of nine players to the IPL.

Mushfiqur Rahim, Mahmudullah Riyad, Mashrafe Bin Mortaza, Abdur Razzaq, Imrul Kayes, Rubel Hossain, Jahurul Islam and Nasir Hossain apart from the former vicecaptain Tamim were on the list. Former captain Shakib Al Hasan is already under contract with Kolkata Knight Riders which runs upto 2013.

India's VVS Laxman, S Sreesanth and Brendon McCullum of New Zealand have commanded the highest reserve price of 400,000 dollars in the final auction shortlist. The Kochi trio joins England off-spinner Graeme Swann, who is yet to feature in the IPL, as the four players to command the maximum reserve price.

On January 20, the Board of Control for

Cricket in India had released a preliminary list comprising of 183 players, who hadn't participated in earlier seasons of the IPL. That has been pruned further by the IPL organisers based on the feedback received from the franchises. The Kochi players, who weren't part of the earlier list, were expectedly included, and the entire roster of players will go under the hammer on February 4 in Bangalore.

"The shortlist comprises some outstanding cricket talent," the IPL chairman Rajeev Shukla said. "Given that it was prepared on the basis of the feedback of the franchises themselves, the stage is set for an exciting and eventful player auction, this Saturday. The franchises purchased the bulk of their respective squads in 2011. Their aim at the upcoming auction will be to bring in some players who can make a difference to their prospects in the tournament. The auction will mark the formal opening of IPL 2012."

In all, 16 Kochi players feature in the list including the newly-appointed Sri Lanka captain Mahela Jayawardene (reserve price 300,000 dollars) and the retired off-spinner Muttiah Muralidaran (200,000 dollars). The

# Carlos to end BFF wants career in 2012 DFAs to vote

Brazilian World Cup winner Roberto Carlos has told a Spanish sports paper he will finish his playing career in December this year at Russian club Makhachkala Anzhi.

The 38-year-old, a World Cup winner in 2002 and finalist in 1998, as well as a legendary former player at Real Madrid, says his player/manager contract at the Russian club lets him hang up his boots this year.

"My contract as a player with Anzhi ends in June 2013. But in December I have the possibility to stop playing," he was quoted as telling Spain's biggest-selling sports daily Marca.

"After that I will carry on in the club as assistant to the chairman Suleyman Kerimov ... He has asked me to help create a structure in the club for the next 10 years," he said in the interview.

"I am not going because I am injured. But I am going because my sporting career is already complete. I have been with Palmeiras, Inter, Real Madrid... I have lived everything I had to live as a player."

As well as the World Cup, Carlos took three Champions League titles and three Spanish championships with the Real Madrid of fellow Brazilian Ronaldo and French international Zinedine Zidane.

If one match stood out in his career, the left-winger told Marca, it would be the Real Madrid-Juventus Champions League final in 1998, which delivered the Spanish club's

seventh Champions League win after a long drought. "It meant a lot to me and to all the Madrid fans. We won the title after 32 years... the only thing that annoys me is that I could not win the Cup," Carlos said.

"Two goals will stay with me. The one I scored with Brazil against France from a free kick (in the 1997 Confederations Cup). The effect was fantastic. And the one I scored from a corner with Real Madrid against Tenerife (bending the ball

from the corner into the net in February 1998)." Carlos said he believed he and fellow Brazilian great Cafu had shown that that wingers can do more than defend. "We were very much on the offensive but they criticized us, too."

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) is keen to keep the voting rights of the District Football Associations (DFA) in the next election, even though the FIFA and AFC advised

the BFF in 2008 to keep all DFAs out of the 2012 election. "We unanimously believe that the country's football will not improve and prosper without the involvement of the districts. To uphold the democratic procedure at the BFF, we feel the representatives of the DFAs are needed and we will try to keep their voting rights in the next election," said BFF senior vice-president Abdus Salam Murshedy after a mara-

thon five-hour meeting at the BFF House yesterday. Before the 2008 election, the then BFF president SA Sultan guaranteed the AFC and FIFA that DFAs would be members of the Divisional Football Associations only and not automatic members of the BFF. The structure of DFAs in the new format should come into force from the next election to be held by end of April 2012.
