Five Jamaat-Shibir men held

Five Jamaat-Shibir activists, including a leader, were arrested by police yesterday in connection with Monday's clashes between law enforcers and Jamaat-Shibir men in the city's Hatim Khan area which left one dead and 80 others injured.

The arrestees are Aminul Islam, ameer of Rajshahi's west regional unit Jamaat-e-Islami; Nuruzzaman, publicity secretary of Rajshahi University unit Islami Chhatra Shibir; Nahid Akhtar, general secretary of Institute of Health Technology unit Shibir; and Shibir activists Habibur Rahman and M Sanaullah, said police.

The arrestees were identified from photos, video footage and statements of seven Jamaat-Shibir activists arrested after Monday's clashes, said Sub-Inspector of Boalia Police Station Imaul Haque.

1,120 litres of soybean oil seized

Law to recognise farm workers on cards

The government will recognise farm workers by amending Bangladesh Labour Act, 2006 in the next parliamentary session, said Labour and Employment Minister Engineer Khandker Mosharraf Hossain at a rally yesterday. The government's aim to

upgrade the country into a medium income one by 2021 would not be possible without the agricultural sector's development as it is a major contributor to the national economy, he added.

The rally was organised by Krishi Sramik Odhikar Mancha in the city's Suhrawardy Udyan.

Bangladesh Institute of Labour Studies Assistant Executive Director Syed Sultan Uddin Ahmed placed a 13-point demand.

It includes a law to ensure farm workers' rights, listing and providing agricultural workers identity cards, eliminating sex discrimination, establishing an agriculture based industry and ensuring fare price of farm produce.

'Big' allocation to repair roads in next budget Ashraful tells House

The government will allocate a "very big" amount of money in the next budget for renovation of roads across the country rather than constructing new roads, bridges, and culverts, LGRD Minister Syed Ashraful Islam said in parliament yesterday.

"We have done a study which shows repairing the roads is more necessary than constructing new roads, bridges, and culverts at present. That's why we have decided to allocate a very big amount in the budget for renovation purposes instead of allocating money for construction of new ones", he said.

Ashraful, also general secretary of the ruling Awami League, said the successive governments since 1996,

when he become a member of parliament, have not allocated any money in the budget for renovation, turning the roads and highways into bad shape.

Replying to lawmakers' queries, he

acknowledged that money was misused in the name of repairing roads in many cases. Responding to another query,

Ahsraful said his ministry has a huge amount of money but could not spend for the construction of new union parishad complexes for want of lands in respective areas.

"The LGRD ministry may have to send back the money this year again if the respective union parishad authorities fail to provide at least 25 decimals of land to construct the parishad complexes", he said.

On dependency of groundwater in the capital and the port city of Chittagong, Ashraful told the House that underground water level in the city has been depleting by about 2-3 metres every year and it is about five metres in the port city. SEWERAGE MASTER

The minister said a master plan on the Dhaka city sewerage management will be finalised by July this year, as the Denmark-based consultation farm M/S Grontmij has already completed the draft plan. The consultation farm has also identified priority basis works design regarding the master plan, he added.

He informed parliament that preparation of tender documents is underway to carry out the priority-based activities identified by the farm.

An elderly man died after unknown persons slit his throat near his house in South Gohira of Raozan upazila early yesterday.

The deceased is Milon Chowdhury, 60.

Police said they were yet to suspect anybody as the killer.

Milon was found injured

near his house around 6:00am yesterday and was declared dead in Chittagong Medical College Hospital.

Uttam Chowdhury, son of the victim, said his cousins, with whom Milon had a longstanding feud, might be involved in the killing.

He said they [cousins] assaulted his father and mother on January 9 and had been threatening his family since then. He filed a general diary (GD) with Raozan Police Station at that time, he added.
