

## Club officials up in arms

The chaos that have gripped domestic cricket in the country continued unabated as ten of the 12 participating clubs threatened to boycott the suspended Premier Division Cricket League if the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) failed to resume the competition immediately.

The club officials made the announcement in a hurriedly-called press conference at a local hotel where they also warned the authorities concerned that they will not release their contracted players for the coming Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) T20. "We have only one desire -- an uninter-

rupted league. You know the clubs have been spending huge money and they will face huge loss if they don't get an uninterrupted league and you cannot stop the league at your whim without discussion with the clubs," said Manzur Kader, president of Sheikh Jamal Dhanmondi Club.

"We can't let go of this matter without any protest, which is why we have gathered here. We are in favour of playing cricket and our demand is very simple -- resume the league immediately otherwise we will boycott the league. On the other hand we have also

decided not to release our contracted players for the BPL and in that case the board must talk with us about our financial loss and risk of injury to the players if they particiapate," said Shawkat Ali Khan Jahangir, president of Victoria Sporting Club.

The ten top-flight clubs met in protest of BCB's decision to suspend the Dhaka Premier Division Cricket League for an indefinite period though the Cricket Committee of Dhaka Metropolis (CCDM) earlier assured them of the completion of the first round by February 6. Abahani and Mohammedan, however, did not join in the campaign though the other club officials confirmed that the two popular clubs clubs expressed their solidarity regarding release of the players for the BPL.

All of a sudden BCB's acting CEO Nizamuddin Chowdhury issued a letter on Wednesday night where it said that BCB president AHM Mustafa Kamal, who was scheduled to return home last night after attending the ICC meeting, ordered the suspension of the league. Gazi Tank, who had a match against Abahani on Thursday, appeared at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur when they got the CCDM's letter at 10am.

Whispers were doing the rounds that the BCB president made the unexpected decision to fulfill the desire of Abahani, who were

### Aamer freed from jail

Pakistan cricketer Mohammad Aamer was released Wednesday from a British jail after serving half of a six-month sentence for his part in a spot-fixing scam.

The 19-year-old was freed from Portland Prison in Dorset, south-west

England. Aamer, then a rising star of world cricket, was one of three Pakistan players jailed by a judge in London in November over their roles in a plan to bowl deliberate no-balls during a Test against England atLord's in August 2010.

However, he cannot immediately return to cricket as he is serving a fiveyear ban from the sport imposed by the International Cricket Council (ICC) for his role in the scandal.

Salman Butt, 27, was sentenced to two and a half years for his role as the "orchestrator" of the scam while seamer Mohammad Asif, 28, received a 12month prison term for bowling a fraudulent no-ball.

Mazhar Majeed, 36, the Londonbased sports agent who organised the scam was jailed for two years and eight months.

All three players are serving fiveyear ICC bans. The scandal emerged as a result of an

undercover investigation by now defunct British tabloid News of the World.

Both Butt and Aamer had appeals Former Pakistan Test captain against their sentences rejected in November, with England's top judge saying they had "betrayed" their country.

Lord Chief Justice Igor Judge said Aamer was a "prodigious young talent with huge potential" that might be "irreparably damaged" by his time out of the game.

"This is, of course, his own loss and cricket will also be the poorer for the loss." SEE PAGE 17 COL 2
