# Victoria slip from top

Rifatullah's unbeaten 103 ensured Kalabagan Krira Chakra a fighting 3-wicket win over Victoria Sporting Club in a Dhaka Premier League yesterday.

The win at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur, and Bangladesh Biman's five-wicket loss at the hands of Prime Doleshwar, gave Kalabagan a reprieve in their battle to survive in the league.

The equation at the bottom of the table has Biman in the danger zone as they have finished their first round matches with two wins from ten games while Kalabagan still have a game in hand (against Brothers Union at the BKSP on Wednesday).

#### VICTORIA-KALABAGAN

Having decided to chase, Kalabagan put Victoria on a tight leash from the beginning with only Kamran Younus and Asif Zakir threatening big scores. Only Kamran made a half-century, also adding 64 for the third wicket with Asif and another 52 with Sabbir Rahman for the fifth wicket.

Victoria suffered three run-outs, all by Nasiruddin Faruque, as they only just made it past the 200-mark.

Kalabagan began poorly and were wobbling at 66 for four when Rifatullah and Abid Ali rescued their chase. The Kalabagan No 3 struck eight boundaries and two sixes in his 129-ball knock that was altogether eventful.

Their fifth wicket stand of 94 runs was broken at the end of the 42nd over when Abid was found guilty of obstructing the field. After the longish stoppage due to the umpires' delay in taking the decision, Mohammad Salman coolly struck two boundaries and a six to help Kalabagan to the finish line.

#### **BIMAN-DOLESHWAR**

Khaled Latif's 86 gave Biman a more than average score -- 227-8 in 50 overs -- to defend against Prime Doleshwar at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium.

But steady batting by Mehedi Maruf, who made 63, and a late burst from Manvinder Singh, who struck six boundaries in his unbeaten 36-ball 43, guided Prime Doleshwar to victory with 11 balls to spare.

The win gives the Doleshwar side a chance at the Super League, though they have to beat league leaders Old DOHS in their last game today.

## Pak complete Eng sweep

Pakistan's bowlers sealed an emphatic 71-run win in the third and final Test against England here on Monday; inflicting a 3-0 series whitewash humiliation in the process.

Set a daunting 324-run target, England were bowled out for 252 with paceman Umar Gul taking 4-61 and off-spinner Saeed Ajmal (4-67) to help Pakistan achieve a first-ever Test clean sweep against their opponents.

again it was always a difficult task for England's batsmen, who have been unable to

play the Pakistani spinners throughout the series, on a weary fourth day pitch at Dubai Stadium.

Pakistan won the first Test here by ten wickets and the second by 72 runs in Abu Dhabi.

Pakistan have also become the first team to win a Test after being bowled out for under 100 since 1907 when England, shot out for 76, beat South Africa at Leeds.

It was England's seventh series whitewash, their first at the hands of Pakistan. Pakistan have now recorded five series whitewashes, With the ball turning their last coming in a 3-0 win over Bangladesh in 2003.

England's last series whitewash came in 2007

when they were routed by Australia 5-0.

So dominating have been Pakistan spinners that Ajmal finished the series with 24 and Rehman with 19.

England, 89-2 at lunch, were still in with a chance with Alastair Cook (49) and Kevin Pietersen (18) batting well but they lost four wickets in the space of 84 runs. They went to tea at 173-6.

Pietersen, who struggled for runs in the series, hit Abdul Rehman for a boundary and then hoisted him for a six to post England's 100. But Ajmal struck from the other end.

The off-spinner produced a beautiful delivery to bowl Pietersen through the gate for 18. He had a mere 67

runs for the series during which he was out to spinners on five occasions.

In his next over, Ajmal produced another sharp turning delivery which caught the edge of Cook's bat and was smartly held by a diving Younis Khan in the lone slip.

Ian Bell (10) and Eoin Morgan (31) added 37 for the fifth wicket but again failed to produce a big score in the series as Gul dismissed them in the space of just three runs.

Pakistan took the second new ball at 196-6 and the first ball saw Gul dismissing Stuart Broad (18) and then Graeme Swann on one.

## C'ship League finally on

The much-awaited second-tier professional football league got underway yesterday with Uttar Baridhara Club and Beanibazar SC playing out a 1-1 draw in the dull opening match of the Premier Bank Bangladesh Championship League yesterday.

Tajul Khan put Beanibazar ahead in the 26th minute through a spot kick only to see his goal cancelled out by an unexpected strike from Tony Borman in the 35th minute.

The introduction of the second-tier football league will finally bring a semblance of professionalism into a system that often sees clubs fast-tracked into the Bangladesh Premier League, like with Team BJMC this season. The second-tier was supposed to start in 2009 but the BFF struggled to bring order into the system for the last three years. They have been successful this year following a series of meetings with the seven participating teams, although a blemish will see Chittagong Mohammedan not take part despite being relegated last season.

"The aim of creating footballers through the second-tier football league will not be succeeded unless the pipelines of district football are revived as the standard of the players between Bangladesh Premier League and Bangladesh Championship League is quite vast," said former national footballer Riazuddin adding that they had struggled hard to collect the quality players for Beanibazar SC.

Running the club may not be a factor for Beanibazar as a lot of former Mohammedan organisers involved themselves with the outfit but it is a big issue for Uttar Baridhara Club, who have been playing the second-tier league from the
