## Ferry disorder often turns trip to Kuakata repulsive

All the five ferries operating on three routes of Kuakata-Kalapara road often go out of order, much to the sufferings of locals as well as tourists to Kuakata sea beach.

Vehicles often get stuck for long hours due to the situation, making journey to the picturesque tourist spot a repulsive one.

There are three ferry routes on 22 km long Kuakata-Kalapara road --Kalapara on Andharmanik River, Hazipur on Sonatala River and Mohipur on Shibbaria River.

The Roads and Highways Department (RHD) runs two ferries each at Mohipur and Kalapara and one at Hazipur.

All the five ferries are designed to run with two engines but each of them uses a single engine as one in every ferry has remained permanently dysfunctional for long.

Disruption of ferry service on the routes has become a regular matter as the single engines often go out of order due to the extra load.

on Hazipur route, carrying eight vehicles including buses, private cars and trucks, went out of order in the mid river and moved about 3 km away under the impact of the low tide, leaving over two hundred passengers in great anxiety.

Later mechanics from Patuakhali ferry divisional office fixed the engine and the ferry service resumed at noon. Around midnight the same day, the engine again went out of order and mechanics were able to run it at about 7:00am on Saturday.

"I along with my wife and two children had to suffer a lot as we got stranded at Hazipur ferry ghat from 7:00am to 12 noon on Friday," said Rezaul Haque, who was going from Dhaka to Kuakata as a tourist.

The government should ensure better ferry service on the road considering the interest of tourists, he said.

"One of the two engines has remained dysfunctional for one year and we have to run the ferry with the remaining one that is also in a bad condition for lack of renovation. Very often it stops functioning," said Chan At about 5:00am on Friday, the ferry Mia, driver of a ferry on the route.

Md Mojibur Rahman, supervisor of the ferry, said the ferry went out of order as many as four times in a week, leaving a large number of vehicles including passenger buses, private cars and trucks stranded on both sides of the terminal.

Md Alim, driver of a passenger bus plying Kuakata-Barisal route, said, "We have to suffer greatly as ferry service on the three routes is in a very bad condition. When a ferry goes out of order, many passengers leave buses and cross the river on country boats to go to their destination. This causes us serious losses."

When contacted, Md Mozammel Haque, sub-divisional engineer (Ferry) of Patuakhali RHD, said, "Import of spare parts of these Germany and England made ferry engines have remained stopped and so, we try to run the engines with country-made parts. But they do not function properly and disruption of the ferry service has become a common scene here."

"The problem will be solved when the ongoing work for construction of bridges across the three rivers completes. But it will take several years," he added.

## Nine murdered last month

Nine people were murdered in separate incidents in four upazilas of Gaibandha district last month.

Of them, three were killed in Sundarganj and Gobindaganj upazilas each, two in Palashbari upazila and one was killed in Saghata upazila.

In Sundarganj, former union parishad member Hafizur Rahman and his men killed Shahdat Hossain, 44, of Boraikandi village during a clash with their rivals over capture of a disputed land at the village on January 5.

Dowry-greedy Raju Mia killed his wife Nazma Akhter, 30, at Sarbananda village following an altercation over the issue on January 6.

Police recovered the body of Manik

Chandra, 35, at Nachni Ghagoa village in the upazila on January 29. Law enforcers are yet to unearth clues to the murder. In Gobindagnj, college student Abu

Hasan, 20, was killed by a gang of criminals near the upazila headquarters on January 20. Locals said Hasan was murdered as a sequel to a previous enmity with his neighbours over the ownership of a land at the village.

One Nurul Islam, 48, was beaten to death by his rivals in the same upazila the same day.

On the night of January 20, Rashidul Islam, 35, a teacher of Parboira Girls' High School, was stabbed to death by an unidentified gang in Gobindaganj upazila. Teachers, students and local people brought out a procession at the

upazila headquarters the following day demanding immediate arrest of the killers. Later, they handed over a memorandum to the upazila nirbahi officer (UNO).

Pobnapur village was killed by one Joynal

In Palashbari, Mintu Mondol, 50, of

of the village following an altercation over a trivial matter on January 14. Joynal has been absconding since the incident. Garment worker Aminur Rahman of Sui village in the upazila was abducted

and then killed by unknown criminals on January 9. None of the killers was arrested as of yesterday. In Saghata, one Momena Begum, 55,

of Falia Digor village in the upazila was killed by unknown criminals on January 7. The reasons behind the murder could not be known.

## UP chairman in Faridpur killed

Criminals killed Moloy Bose, 45, chairman of Atghar union parishad in Saltha upazila yesterday morning.

Locals said a gang of 5-6 assailants intercepted Moloy at Ronokail village in Sadar upazila while he along with one Sohag was returning home from the district town by a motorbike at about 11:00am.

The gang started to stab him indiscriminately on head and other parts of the body, leaving him dead on the spot.

Moloy was the son of Monendra Nath Bose of Sarukhdia village in Saltha upazila. Police recovered the body

and sent it to Faridpur General Hospital morgue for autopsy.
