### Legal action to be taken for false info

Minister tells House

Legal action will be taken against those persons who had received plots in the capital's Banani by giving false affidavits during the BNP-led four-party government's tenure.

State Minister for Housing and Public Works Abdul Mannan Khan yesterday said this in parliament while replying to lawmakers' queries. In his written answer, Mannan told the House that all the

55 plots in Banani were allocated "lawfully" based on their

affidavits which stated that they had no other plots or flats in the capital after their names. The state minister, however, backtracked on his earlier position when his party's deputies alleged that some of the

55 allottees, including BNP leader Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu, were given plots "unlawfully". When Awami League lawmaker Nazma Akhter questioned the credibility of Pinu's affidavit, the state minister

said, "It's out of the question to believe that none of the 55 persons had a plot or flat in the city [while they were given plots at Banani]." Mannan said a parliamentary sub-committee is investi-

gating the allotment process of the plots. "I must take action against those who had got plots by giving false affidavits," he He said, "I am giving you [lawmakers] 100 percent guarantee that I will take action after I get the sub-committee

report without delaying a moment. They will not be able to escape anyway." The 55 plots were allotted to the past BNP-Jamaat ministers, lawmakers and other loyalists during its tenure.

# second highest peak

The power of will was behind all his successes and anybody can succeed in life if he or she is strongly determined, Everest hero Musa Ibrahim said as he launched his first-ever book "Mission Bangaposhagor O Kilimanjaro" at the city's Liberation War Museum yesterday.

The book has been written to inspire people to overcome tough barriers of their mind to achieve anything, Musa said, adding that the book tells about his expeditions of conquering Kilimanjaro and crossing the 14km Bangla Channel by swimming.

Commerce Minister GM Quader, who unveiled the book, said Musa has been working for building the image of the country. Writing a book after this kind of achievement for the future generation is really a great work, he added.

The minister also handed over a flag to Musa and his co-mountaineer Niaz Morshed Patwari, as they are set to conquer Aconcagua, the world's second highest peak.

It is the third venture of Musa's sevensummit mission. As the first Bangladeshi, he has already conquered Mount Everest and Kibo, the highest peak of Africa.

Musa said the Aconcagua journey will start on February 12 and it may take 14 days to reach the top. The 22,841-foot high Aconcagua is the highest mountain in the Americas. It is located in the Andes mountain range in the Argentine province of Mendoza.

JAN Associates Ltd chief executive officer Abullah H Kafi, Daffodil International University chairman Sabur Khan, and Extreme Bangla president Kazi Hamidul Haque, among others, also addressed the programme.

## Musa set to conquer world's Kabir Chy spurned Pak govt statement in 1971

National Professor Kabir Chowdhury had refused to sign a statement prepared by the then Pakistan government of 1971 stating that reports of mass killing and genocide in the country were "untrue", knowing that his life could be endangered by such refusal.

The Pakistan government, somehow, had published the statement in the New York Times with Kabir Chowdhury's name, said Finance Minister AMA Muhith in his Kabir Chowdhury memorial speech yesterday.

Intelligence officials of the Pakistan government later had asked Kabir Chowdhury to sign the document to authenticate the published statement,

he said. "And he [Kabir Chowdhury] refused once again." Muhith was addressing the Kabir

Chowdhury memorial speech and discussion at Bilia auditorium in the city. Forum for Secular Bangladesh and

Trial of War Criminals of 1971 organised

the event in commemoration of Kabir Chowdhury's 90th birth anniversary. Speakers said Kabir Chowdury was a teacher of teachers and a leader of poli-

ticians. "He spent his entire life in teaching, from the beginning to the very end," said

AMA Muhith. When Kabir Chowdhury was requested to teach at the National University, he first wanted to design a whole new course on fundamentalism and later teach that course there, said educationist Borhanuddin Khan Jahangir.

In fact, Kabir Chowdhury had spent his entire life fighting against religious fundamentalism as well as against moves to transform Bangladesh into another Pakistan, said National Professor Salahuddin Ahmed.


