# BCL men beat up journo at RU

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists at Rajshahi University (RU) severely beat up a journalist confining him to a room on the campus early yesterday.

Victim, Nazim Mridha, a RU correspondent of daily New Age and a student of Law and Justice department, was admitted to the university medical centre.

Nazim told The Daily Star that BCL men of Bangabandhu Hall where he resides took to the room of the hall unit BCL convenor Shah Mohammad Selim for publishing a report headlined "Chhatra League forces students to join procession" in his daily. At one stage, BCL men Selim, Ridoy Ahmed, Sohel Rana, Dev,

Asadur Rahman, Tarek Ahmed, Shakil Ahmed, Masud Rana, Selim Hossain, Mushfikur Rahman and Alamin severely beat him up and tortured him mentally for an hour till 1:30am, the victim alleged. The BCL men also threatened to kill him if he discloses the

matter and publishes further report over the torture, he added. Later, the BCL activists freed him when the hall provost SA Haider asked them after getting the news.

A GD was lodged with Motihar Police Station seeking security of Nazim's life. Protesting the incident, Rajshahi University Journalists

Association (Ruja) demanded immediate punishment to the BCL men and their expulsion from the university as well as from the BCL unit.

Ruja also threatened to go for tougher agitation on the campus if the BCL men are not expelled by 10:00am today.

Contacted, RU Bangabandhu hall unit BCL convenor Selim denied the allegation.

At least 15 journalists were assaulted by the university unit BCL men in the last six months, sources said.

# Use renewable energy to cut cost

# Suggests Matia

The government should focus more on renewable energy for power generation, as dependence on imported petroleum products is proving costly amid dwindling gas reserves, the agriculture minister said yesterday.

"At this moment, we will not be able to extract coal, as we do not have scientific methods. Neither the gas reserve is sufficient", Matia Chowdhury said. So more focus should be on renewable energy, she added. "...when we planned for rental power

plants, the price of oil was about US\$82 a barrel. It is now over \$129 a barrel. The economy, thus, is under pressure to accommodate the increase", she said. The minister made her observation and

recommendation at the inaugural ceremony of a workshop organised for leading experts and chiefs of the various state-run energy related companies at Bidyut Bhaban in the city yesterday. The two-day event, aimed at finding ways

out to further improve the country's power and energy sectors, was organised by the power, energy, and mineral resources minis-Bangladesh has targeted to take its elec-

tricity generation capacity to 38,185 megawatts (MW) by 2030, anticipating that the demand would rise to 33,708MW. The government, however, plans to produce only 111MW of electricity from renew-

able energy sources, which, according to the

agriculture minister, is too low. Her com-

ments also poured cold water on the Power

Development Board's (PDB) plan to produce 9,850MW of electricity from domestic

Bangladesh has discovered five coalmines, which have a combined reserve of about 2,797 million tonnes of high quality bituminous coal. But the country is failing to extract the natural resource due to indecision over extraction method.

The agriculture minister said she does not think that the common people would not be interested in setting up solar energy

Energy Adviser to the Prime Minister, Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury, called for coordination among all stakeholders to implement the country's power vision by 2021, saying, "It will not be tough to achieve the target if everybody works in unison".

He said the government would have to work hard to construct the transmission line to take power to the people.

On average, Bangladesh produces 5,000MW of electricity, taking power to half of the population, according to the

Sheikh M Wahid-Uz-Zaman, principal secretary to the prime minister, said Bangladesh would have to spend \$48.5 billion to implement its power sector master plan.

The government has drawn up plans to improve the power situation, but implementation is the biggest challenge now, said Energy Secretary Mohammad Mejbahuddin

Muhammad Enamul Huq, state minister for power, and Abul Kalam Azad, power secretary, also spoke.

## BID TO END VITAMIN A DEFICIENCY

## Oil fortification law next yr fication of the processing operations and is

In a bid to improve people's access to vitamin A through fortification, the government has planned to introduce mandatory oil fortification law by next year, according to sources at the industries ministry.

"The government is actively considering introducing a mandatory law to this end. It has also planned to roll out an awareness campaign to educate consumers about the benefit of vitamin A fortified oil," a senior official of the ministry told the news agency yesterday.

An estimated 22 percent of preschool age children in the country suffer from vitamin A deficiency, which is the leading cause of blindness in children, according to Unicef.

Fortification of oil requires very little modi-

relatively simple and the oil protects the vitamin A from oxidation during storage and facilitates absorption of vitamin, said Dr Ireen Akhter Chowdhury, nutrition officer of Unicef, Bangladesh. Industries Minister Dilip Barua said, "So

far, everyone in Bangladesh takes about

20.51gm oil a day in their daily foods. That's

why, Vitamin A fortified oil will obviously change the Vitamin A deficiency scenario in the country." Meanwhile, the ministry with BSTI and oil refiners has already been implementing a project (Jan 2010-Dec 2012) titled "Fortifica-

tion of Edible Oil in Bangladesh" to that end. GAIN (Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition) is providing fund while Unicef giving technical assistance for the project.


