# NBR sniffs for tax

The money involved in Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) T20 tournament has come under the scanner of the National Board of Revenue (NBR).

NBR has formed a team to monitor all financial transactions -- roughly hundreds of crores of taka -- in a bid to ensure that all taxes are going to the state coffers, said revenue officials yesterday.

The tax administration has already collected Tk 25 akh as revenue from the organisers for hiring artistes, including Bollywood actresses, for the gala opening ceremony of the tournament.

Headed by Kanon Kumar Roy, director general of Directorate of Inspection (Taxes), Dhaka, the NBR team will examine all deals, like the auction of teams and players, and payments, made by the six franchises to the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB).

It will look into the deal between BCB and Game on Sports, the firm that bought the rights of BPL for six years SEE PAGE 7 COL 1

# Iran set to open major N-projects

Vows not to cave in to sanctions, threats of West, Israel

AFP, Tehran

A defiant Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad vowed yesterday to inaugurate "important nuclear projects" within days and lashed out at Israel, saying the "story" of the Holocaust underpinning its existence had been "smashed".

In a speech marking the anniversary of Iran's 1979 Islamic revolution, Ahmadinejad said his nation will "never

yield" to Western sanctions and threats of military action from Israel and the United States.

A crowd of an estimated 30,000 people in central Tehran cheered Ahmadinejad's words. Many held aloft placards declaring 'Death to America" and "Death to Israel".

In pointed messages aimed at those two arch-foes, Iranian officials planted a full-scale model of a US spy drone **SEE PAGE 19 COL 4**

#### Professor M. Omar Rahman appointed as Vice Chancellor of Independent University, Bangladesh

The Chancellor of the University and the Hon'ble President of the People's Republic of Bangladesh has appointed Professor M. Omar Ejaz Rahman as Vice Chancellor of Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB), effective from January 26, 2012.

Prior to his appointment as Vice Chancellor, Prof. Rahman was the Pro Vice Chancellor of IUB since April, 2006 and Vice Chancellor (in charge) from January 2011. Prof. Rahman is also concurrently Professor of Demography and Director of the Centre

for Health, Population and Development at IUB. Prior to joining IUB in 2003, Prof. Rahman was Associate Professor of Epidemiology and Demography

at Harvard University, and a Research Fellow in Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School. He continues to serve as a visiting faculty member at Harvard University.

Prof. Rahman has had a brilliant academic career. He completed his Bachelor's degree with honours (A.B.) in Biochemical Sciences from Harvard College in 1979, followed by his MD from Northwestern University Medical School in 1983. Subsequently he received his MPH in Health Policy and Management from Harvard University in 1986 and his D.Sc. in Epidemiology also from Harvard University in 1990. Prof. Rahman trained in Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School and is a US board certified psychiatrist.

Prof. Rahman is an internationally renowned Demographer and Psychiatrist with extensive experience in International Public Health. He is the author of multiple peer-reviewed articles on a variety of health and population related subjects, and has edited several books/chapters. He has received numerous research grants from the U.S. National Institutes of Health, WHO, and various U.N. agencies. .He has served as a consultant to various international organizations including UN agencies, the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank. His major current research interests are: Higher Education Policy in the Developing World; Professional Outmigration; Health impacts of Climate Change and Public Health Approaches to Mental Health in the Developing World.
