Razia locked into an altercation with Safia Saturday night over her involvement in an affair with a local youth. Khalilur said the girl

might have committed suicide over the issue.

The body was sent to Dhaka Medical College morgue for autopsy.

Vessels stranded as Ghat workers protest

Chittagong Ghat and Gudam Sramik Union observed a strike in 16 ghats adjoining Karnaphuli river yesterday, leaving at least 150 vessels stranded, protesting the alleged assault on its leaders on Saturday night. Members of the union and Chattagram Ghat and

Gudam Sramik Sangram Parishad, recently formed with the union's defecting members, clashed at Banglabazar Ghat area that night leaving six people injured.

The clash ensued over collecting money for a welfare fund for ghat workers.

The fund's formation was decided at a meeting between local lawmaker MA Latif and goods importers, lighter vessel owners and workers on January 25. The clash ensued when the union leaders told the

parishad leaders to start collecting the money though the fund was yet to be formed, added the sources.

The union President Md Abdul Quader and the parishad Convener Mohammad Alamgir blamed each other's organisations for trying to collect the money.

BNP withdraws expulsion order on Ratan

7 arrested for cheating army jobseekers

Detective Branch of Police arrested seven people from Satkhira and the capital on Saturday and Friday for cheating jobseekers of Bangladesh Army and misleading police.

Following complaints from around 30 victims, the ringleader, Mithun Ghosh alias Apu, 33, impersonating an army major, and his wives, Beauty and Ranu Mondol, were arrested with many fake appointment letters from Satkhira on Friday night. As per their confessions, Raju, Sumon, Hasan and Jalal

Uddin were nabbed from a residential flat at Tilpapara of the city's Khilgaon the next day with computers and printers.

The frauds organised fake army recruitment tests and then sent letters to district police stations using the fake seal of army's Azimpur recruitment office requesting verification of the applicants, said DB Senior Police Commissioner Moshiur Rahman.

Applicants became confident once police came to check their identities and gave the frauds Tk 1.5 to 3 lakh for the posts of sepoys, computer operators and nurses, he added.

President completes 3 years in office

A special prayer seeking divine blessings for the good health of the president and his family was also offered.

49pc women face physical Einstein has not lost violence by husbands

Shows survey

More than 50 percent of the women in a baseline survey across the country reported of facing physical and sexual violence by their husbands over the last 12 months.

Of the 1,982 women selected for the survey from the country's 30 unions, around 49 percent faced physical violence while about 42 percent face sexual violence during the period.

The findings were presented yesterday at a national workshop titled "Challenges and opportunities for addressing violence against women in Bangladesh" organised by Plan Bangladesh at a city hotel.

The survey was carried out under Protecting Human Rights (PHR) Project, an initiative of Plan Bangladesh in assistance with USAid.

Presenting the key findings, Dr Madhumita Das, senior technical specialist of ICRW, India, said slapping a woman, throwing something at her and threatening her with a weapon are the most common acts of the violence.

She said one-third of the surveyed women reported experiencing forced sexual intercourse after or during an episode of physical violence while very few women sought help from any formal or informal service.

Around 13 percent stated violence as normal or not serious action while 11 percent believe that it will bring bad name for the family, she added.

The survey stressed the need for gender sensitisation across the population in the study area.

Dr Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury, state minister for women and children affairs ministry, Meher Afroz Chumki, chairman of parliamentary standing committee on women and children affairs ministry and Tariq-Ul-Islam, secretary of the ministry, Alexious Butler, director of democracy and governance office of USAid Bangladesh, and Myrna Remata Evora, country director of Plan Bangladesh also spoke among others.

Two RU physicists tell int'l seminar

Albert Einstein has not lost even if the subatomic particles called neutrinos travel faster than light, two former Rajshahi University physicists, who claimed to have completed the theory of special relativity by deriving new equations, said at an international seminar yesterday.

"Neutrinos have won the race with light but Einstein has not lost", Dr M Osman Gani Talukder, one of the physicists, said in his

largest physics lab, published its experiment results showing that neutrino particles move 60 billionths of a second faster than what they would have done if travelling at the speed of light, says a BBC report. A dilemma surfaced as much of the cen-

On September 23, 2011, Cern, the world's

tury-old modern physics depend on the idea that nothing can exceed the speed of light, theory of special relativity.

which was laid out in part by Einstein in his Dr Talukder and Dr Mushfiq Ahmad said they have solved the dilemma by adopting a

21-equation non-Einsteinian approach and

by completing Einstein's three-equation special relativity theory with the addition of 18 new equations.

The two physicists presented two papers entitled "Homogeneous number system and correspondence between infinity and invariant under addition" and "Neutrino travelling faster than light and Einsteinian and Non-Einsteinian views of relativity" on the concluding day of the two-day seminar yesterday. On the first day, they presented eight papers, out of a total of 10, describing their ideas.

RU Vice Chancellor Prof M Abdus Sobhan said in the concluding session that the university would publish the minutes of the seminar in a journal within a week and post them on the Internet for review by scientists worldwide.

Hartmut Baerwolff, professor at Cologne University of Applied Sciences, Germany, chaired the concluding session.

Rajshahi University organised the international seminar on "special relativity" in association with The Daily Star at RU Senate Bhaban. Channel i was the media partner.

Deliver unmet pledges

Dutch envoy urges AL

The ruling party should speed up efforts and put extra emphasis to fulfill the undelivered pledges in the remaining two years of its tenure, Dutch Ambassador to Bangladesh Alphons Hennekens said at a press conference yesterday.

"After the election victory, the Awami League indicated to move its election and development agenda forward. Looking at the politics, democratisation, economy, we can say the ambitious election manifesto has not been realised yet", he said in a reply to journalists. Hennekens said the AL had announced a very compre-

hensive and ambitious election manifesto before the 2008 election, which covers all aspects. As it has not been realised in three years, the government should speed up efforts in the next two years, he added. He also informed journalists that the Netherlands will provide

200 million Euros (about US\$2.63m) to Bangladesh as bilateral fund and 100 million Euros (\$1.32m) through Dutch NGOs. Being a delta country, the Netherlands has formulated a

100-year concept plan to safeguard itself from the adverse impacts of sea-level rise and climate change, he said. As Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina took interest in the Delta Plan, the Dutch government is planning to sign a MoU with Bangladesh in a couple of months to share the concept and

help Bangladesh make a livable and safe workplace, he said.

The press conference held at the Dutch Embassy in the city was organised in celebration of the 40th anniversary of establishment of diplomatic relations between Bangladesh and the Netherlands. Marking the anniversary, the Dutch ambassador also hosted

a reception on Saturday, says a press release. Finance Minister

AMA Muhith attended the function as the guest of honour.
