'We have lost our son, we want justice'

Human chain at Sagar Sarowar's village

Villagers and relatives of slain journalist Sagar Sarowar formed a human chain at Kazirhat Market in Bera upazila of the district yesterday demanding immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of the killers.

Hundreds of villagers from Masumdia, Rooppur and Kazirhat, the birthplace of Sagar Sarowar, joined the human chain that continued for an hour from 10:00am.

They strongly protested the brutal murder of Sagar Sarowar, a news editor of private TV channel

Maasranga, and his wife Meherun Runi, a senior reporter of ATN Bangla, and demanded immediate arrest of the killers.

Later, the protesters, carrying banners and festoons, took out a procession at the bazar and held a rally there. Chaired by school-teacher Ataur Rahman, also a resident of Kazirhat village, the rally was addressed, among others, by Roopur Union Parishad Chairman Nurul Islam, former chairman of Mashumdia Union Parishad Samsur Rahman, Bera upazila BNP General Secretary Md Rois Uddin,

Sagar's uncle Harunur Rashid, and nephew Abdul Karim.

The speakers urged the law enforcers to immediately unearth the clues to the murder of the journalist couple and arrest the culprits involved. "We have lost our son. We don't want compensation. We want justice," said Harunur Rashid.

The agitating villagers, who joined the rally, chanted slogans in support of their demand. Sagar and his wife Runi were murdered at their flat of the five-storey building in the capital early February.

Charges pressed against 10 in Milon Sheikh murder case

Police pressed charges against 10 people in college student Milon Sheikh murder case on Thursday afternoon.

Milon Sheikh of Tootpara was murdered on the night of May 4, 2011.

The 10 accused are Sakibur Rahman Jitu, Anwarul Islam, Abir Hossain Sheikh, Asad Howlader, Dr. Abdul Kader, Raju, Panna, Sagor, Rafin and Mefta.

Five of the charge sheeted accused are in Khulna district jail while the five others are still at large.

According to the charge-sheet submitted to court of Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (CMM) by investigation officer (IO) of the case SI Md Habibullah of Khulna Sadar PS, Milon, a student of first year honours class at Haji Malek Degree College in the city was abducted on May 4, last year for protesting teasing of his school going sister. He was stabbed to death on the same night by abductors.

On the following day, Babul Sheikh, uncle of the deceased, lodged an FIR with Khulna Sadar police station as complainant naming 10 people and nine unnamed others as accused of the murder.

Bangladesh Human Rights Enforcement Association is providing legal aid to the complainant for conducting the case, said the IO of the case.

Rangpur interns continue strike

Talks with hospital admin fail, nurses join agitation

Intern doctors at Rangpur Medical College and Hospital (RMCH) continued their work abstention for the second day yesterday protesting attack on colleagues and demanding security of staff.

The nurses at the hospital observed two hours' work abstention yesterday demanding the same issue.

The student nurses also called a five-day strike yesterday demanding security at their workplace.

The interns enforced the strike on Friday after Dr Mahmudul Hasan Firoz and two nurses of the hospital were assaulted by relatives of a patient on Thursday night.

Police and hospital sources said, Mahbubur Rahman, a resident of Satgara Mistiripara, was admitted to the hospital with old age complications and died an hour after admission on Thursday night.

Following the death of the 65-year-old patient, the interns and relatives of the patient locked in an altercation. At a stage, the relatives of the patients beat up a doctor and two nurses.

Yesterday, the interns had a meeting with the deputy director of the hospital in the morning where the DD requested them to withdraw the strike.

But the interns announced that their strike will continue till arrest and punishment of the culprits.

The intern doctors association at the hospital had

demanding police camp on the hospital premises due to attack by the outsiders several times. But the authorities remained indifferent, they said.

At the meeting, deputy director Dr Golam Mostafa formed a three-member team to investigate the mat-

ter and ordered it to submit report within five days.

Mostafa said, they filed a case against two relatives of the patient.

Meanwhile, the patients of the hospital started to suffer for absence of intern doctors. A good number of patients left the hospital

yesterday, hospital sources said.

Earlier, the intern doctors brought out a procession on the hospital premises yesterday morning.

The procession paraded the hospital compound and ended at the administrative building.

Having been authorized by the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh (GOB), Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) intends to select a potential sponsor (the 'Sponsor') to incorporate as equity partner along with Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) and Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation (BPC) in the Fuel Supply Company (FSC) to be formed to develop a fuel tank terminal comprising with jetty, fuel receiving system, fuel storage tanks of 1,00,000 MT capacity of liquid fuel (HFO: 80,000 MT and HSD: 20,000 MT) with the provision of 25000 MT proportionate capacity enhancement for future, fuel heating system, fuel transportation and delivery system constructed by the Sponsor on a site at Patenga or any other suitable site in the coastal area in Chittagong along with regional operational Sub-Depots (Minimum 3 Nos. or as required) which (the Project) will be owned by FSC. The selected Sponsor will be required to arrange the necessary debt financing and to execute the key project documents for the project.

The Sponsor will be selected through an international competitive bidding process (Two stage: 1st stage: Pre-qualification process, 2nd stage: Bidding against Request for Proposals by Pre-qualified Applicants) from a pool of applicants (the "Applicants") who meet the criteria set forth in this pre-qualification document.

BPDB seeks to pre-qualify interested applicants who have previous international (for local applicants local experience will be accepted) experience as outlined in the pre-qualification document and invites interested applicants to submit qualification statements in accordance with the criteria set forth in this pre-qualification document. Only applicants whose qualification statements demonstrate that they meet all the criteria set forth in this pre-qualification document will be invited to submit bids for the project. This pre-qualification document (and any amendments thereto) will be available at the BPDB website: <http://www.bpdb.gov.bd>. Interested applicants intending to submit a qualification statement to BPDB should check BPDB's website on a regular basis to ensure that they are familiar with any amendments or modifications to the pre-qualification document, which amendments or modifications shall be binding on the applicants and their qualification statements if such amendments or modifications are posted on BPDB's website not later than 72 hours prior to the pre-qualification closing date.

KCC mayor corrupt, alleges female ward councillor

A female ward councillor on Thursday accused KCC Mayor Talukder Abdul Khaleque of corruption.

Shahida Begum, councillor from reserved seat-2, said in her press statement that the mayor is involved in unbridled corruption, misappropriation of fund, nepotism and politicisation of his administration.

In fact, Khulna City Corporation has turned into a hub of corrupt practices, she said.

Three people in the KCC are enjoying blessing of the city mayor and collecting illegal money from sources during tender, appointment of employees, tax assessment, purchase of spare parts for vehicles and purchase of fuel, she said.

Shahida Begum also disclosed the names and designations of the aforesaid three to the newsmen.

Shahida said that there is no ward councillor on the KCC appointment board. It is because the city mayor does not want councillors to know about the illegal money collected

at the time of appointment of officials and employees, she added.

Citing an example of corruption she said that the mayor did not allow enlisted contractors to participate in the tender bid for repair of damaged roads last month.

Later the work order was issued on February 7 in favour of an engineer's firm which is not on the KCC list.

She further alleged that an aide of the mayor received Tk two lakh from her on February 5 in the name of the mayor for regularising service of a master roll employee.

Mayor Khaleque goes to the constituency of his lawmaker wife every day at Rampal and Mongla upazilas of Bagerhat district by official car while the KCC bears the fuel cost, she alleged.

Contacted, mayor Khaleque refuted the allegations and said that he was never involved in corruption, nepotism and irregularities as state minister in the past and as mayor at present.

The allegations of ward councillor Shahida against me are false and fabricated, unfounded and baseless, he said.
