1,100 NU staff to lose jobs

HC declares appoint illegal

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The High Court yesterday declared illegal the appointment of around 1,100 employees recruited by the National University during the BNP-Jamaat rule for anomalies in advertisement and recruitment process.

The termination comes into effect immediately after pronouncement of the verdict, the court ruled.

Delivering verdict on a writ, the HC asked the NU authorities to make fresh recruitment to the vacant posts within six months.

The employees, who were additional party in the case, would be able to apply for fresh appointment and the provision of age limit would be relaxed for them, according to the verdict.

Deputy Attorney General Bishwajit Roy told The Daily Star around 300 employees became the additional party in the case in

different times to defend their recruit-

The court, however, ruled that they will have to sit for written test and viva-voce to prove their qualities.

The HC bench of Justice Hasan Foez Siddique and Justice Md Jahangir Hossain directed the NU authorities to publish advertisements for fresh recruitment at least five national dailies.

Citing the HC directives, Bishwajit Roy said the NU authorities have to update the office structures of its employees before giving fresh appointment to its different

He said the employees, whose appointment has been cancelled, will not have to refund salaries and other benefits they had earlier taken from the state.

Ghulam Azam lent support to Tikka Khan

Prosecution tells war crimes tribunal

Former Jamaat-e-Islami chief Ghulam Azam met General Tikka Khan at least twice after the Pakistani occupation forces massacred thousands of defenceless Bangalees on March 25, 1971 and assured him of full cooperation, the prosecution told the International Crimes Tribunal yesterday.

Prosecutor Zead Al Malum said the first

meeting with the then East Pakistan governor general was held on April 4, 1971 at the governor's house in Dhaka where Azam met Tikka as part of a 12-member team.

The second was a private meeting of the duo, he added.

At the meetings, Azam termed the freedom fighters "armed intruders", proposed, in company of others, to form a



An unsung hero

Jalilar Rahman of Gaibandha left unrecognised 60 years into Language Movement

When students in Dhaka were agitating for the recognition of Bangla as a state language of Pakistan in 1952, a youth in Gaibandha was marshalling people in the faraway district for the Language Movement.

Aware of the consequences of protesting against the Pakistani rulers, college student M Jalilar Rahman organised processions and rallies and helped build the first

Shaheed Minar in Gaibandha. Though it was the valiant efforts of youths like Jalilar

that gave Bangla its status as a state language, the hero of Gaibandha hardly received any state recognition in his lifetime.

Jalilar, who passed away on December 13, 2005, had never talked much about his contribution to the historic movement.

HC pulls for 2 Old Dhaka structures

Asks authorities to explain demolition

The High Court on Sunday asked the authorities concerned why their failure to preserve two archeological structures in Old Dhaka --


'Shankhanidhi House' and 'Radha-Krishna Temple' -should not be declared illegal.

In response to a writ petition, the bench of Justice HM Shamsuddin Chowdhury and Justice Jahangir Hossain also asked why the failure of taking legal actions against the demolisher should not be declared illegal either.

The rule came after architect Taimur Islam, chief executive of Urban Study Group (USG), filed a writ petition as Ashraf Ali, an influential of the old part of the city, knocked down the aesthetically important establishments in December 2011. The court directed the


