Japan-Korea joint venture set to get job

5 other bidders disqualified

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Power Development Board has disqualified five out of six bidders in the tender for setting up a large public sector electricity plant in Bibiyana on technical grounds.
This is the first ever tender of the PDB where the bid-

ders brought in the project finance instead of the government arranging it.

As a result of this technical disqualification, the PDB would now be left with just one bidder's project financing offer which will be opened later on. This means the PDB will be left with no choice over the financier's interest terms and loan repayment period.

Sources said on Wednesday a tender evaluation committee of the PDB's 300-450 megawatt Bibiyana-3 combined cycle plant project qualified the bid of Japanese-Korean joint venture Marubeni and Hyundai. The bids of the remaining five, all of which are Chinese, were disqualified on various grounds.

The sources said when the bids of the companies were opened after January 17, their documents had one flaw or the other. The PDB's committee on January 24 decided to seek clarification from them all.

However, the PDB actually sought clarification from one bidder only, the Marubeni-Hyundai joint venture. It SEE PAGE 19 COL 3



Iran has dramatically accelerated its production of enriched uranium in recent months while refusing to cooperate with an investigation of

evidence that it may have worked on designing a bomb, a confidential report by the UN nuclear watchdog has said on Friday.

However, Iran said it wants to keep cooperating with UN nuclear watchdog, the Islamic republic's envoy to the IAEA Ali Asghar Soltanieh said. The comments came after the UN

watchdog made public its report.

In the report to member states the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) found Iran had tripled its production rate of uranium enriched to the level of 20% over the past three

Much of the increase in production has taken place at an underground site known as Fordow, and the report's findings will further

increase the international pressure on Iran at a time of already high tension.

Tehran denies that it has nuclear ambitions and says its nuclear programme is for peaceful purpose.

Meanwhile, The New York Times reported yesterday that US intelligence has found no hard evidence that Iran has decided to build a nuclear bomb.




