

# Speakers tell Gaibandha coference OUR CORRESPONDENT, Gaibandha

Speakers at a conference yesterday urged the government, nongovernment organisations and lawyers to ensure jobs and justice for victims of acid violence in order to rehabilitate them and end their economic and social deprivation.

Gaibandha unit of Brac, Acid Survivors Foundation and Manusher Jonno Foundation organised the regional conference of acid survivors at Gaibandha Zila Parishad hall room.

The speakers said though the number of acid violence victims throughout the country rose from 252 in 2001 to 370 in 2003, such acts saw a decrease with 84 victims in The perpetrators are usually sol-

vent and socially influential who slip past legal loopholes and continue to threaten the victims and their families. Most of these victims are poor and refrain from filing cases, they Gaibandha saw 70 incidents of

acid violence till date but only 19 cases were filed. Those accused attained bail and continue to threaten the victims and witnesses, added the speakers. Moreover, only one from the 19

cases reached a verdict where each of the three accused were sentenced to 14 years rigorous imprisonment and fined Tk 50,000, said a lawyer of Gaibandha Judge Court, Anis Mostafa Totan.

The remaining cases are being delayed due to lax monitoring, he

A victim of acid violence, Rehena Begun, of Sadullapur upazila, said her attacker, an army personnel who is still in service, attained bail and continues to threaten her and the case witnesses.

The victims of acid violence present at the conference sought help and cooperation from all in ensuring exemplary punishment of the accused and jobs for their rehabilitation.

Acid Survivors Foundation gave each of the 19 victims Tk 30,000 as grant.

Earlier, the organisers brought out a rally which paraded the roads of Gaibandha town.

# Says NTP report

Around 64,000 people die due to tuberculosis while 3.3 lakh get infected afresh every year in Bangladesh, said a report of the National Tuberculosis Control Programme (NTP).

Of the total infected people, over 50 percent are female

while 3.15 percent are children aged below 15 years, the report NTP Consultant Dr Mujibur Rahman disseminated the information at the Annual Conference on Tuberculosis-2012

organised by the National Anti-Tuberculosis Association of Bangladesh (NATAB) at LGED auditorium in the city yesterday. Dr Rahman stressed the need for involving community leaders and civil society members to raise awareness on the

disease. Law Minister Barrister Shafique Ahmed, while addressing as the chief guest, said more efficient coordination mechanism between the government bodies and non-government organisations is needed to address the issue.

He also urged the young generation to refrain from smoking to avoid getting infected with tuberculosis.

"Teachers, students and civil-society members will have to play a more responsible role to discourage young people from smoking," he said. State Minister for Health Dr Mozibur Rahman Fakir said

the government is working hard to ensure better treatment for people. He said around 12,000 community clinics are active across

the country to provide health care to rural people. "We have already appointed 13,000 new health care providers to work in these community clinics," he added.

NATAB central executive committee Senior Vice President Muzaffar Hossain Paltu chaired the function while its Joint Secretary Khai Uddin Ahmed Mukul, among others, also spoke there.
