His father then filed mercy petitions to the president, following which the latter granted Biplob clemency in the Nurul Islam murder case last year, said the source.

The incident drew widespread criticism from different sections, including rights groups, legal experts and the media.

Babor, who was the secretary of Laxmipur Chhatra League, was convicted in 2004, said his brother Saiful Hasan Palash, himself president of Laxmipur Jubo League.

Their mother Nurjahan Begum appealed to the president last year for clemency, Saiful told The Daily Star over the phone.

The constitution empowers the president to grant pardons, reprieves and respites and to remit, suspend or commute any sentence passed by any court, tribunal or other authority. VICTIMS' FAMILY

#### REACTIONS "We cannot just accept it.

Where will common people go if the president pardons a killer on political considerations?" asked Md Kamal, a nephew of the slain Mohsin. Kamal was also a prosecution witness of the case. Contacted by The Daily

Star, relatives of Kamal expressed their "inability" to comment, saying the accomplices of the killers are already threatening them and giving them a hard time.

On September 18, 2000 advocate Nurul Islam, the then organising secretary of Laxmipur BNP, was abducted and hacked to death by Biplob and his associates.

The Divisional Speedy Trial Tribunal of Chittagong on December 9, 2003, condemned five people, including Biplob, to death for the murder.

BNP activist Kamal was killed at his house in front of his parents by Biplob and his gang in October 2001.

A Speedy Trial Tribunal in Chittagong handed down death sentences on Biplob's two brothers -- Salahuddin Tipu and Abdul Jabbar Lablu. Biplob himself, his father Abu Taher and three others -- Khalek, Babor and Marju -- got life sentences in the case.

The High Court later relieved all but Biplob and Khalek of the charges.

Shibir activist Mohsin was beaten to death on September 5, 2000, near Adarsha High School in Laxmipur.

In a case filed with Laxmipur Police Station. Biplob, Lablu, and Babor were each sentenced to life term in prison.

new avenues of opportunities. It will make out a case for India and China investing in deep-sea port in Bangladesh."

India will also be a major gainer, mainly due to reduction in time and cost of goods transport between its north-eastern states and the rest of the country.

Indian traders might save up to \$50 a tonne through getting the transit facility, he said, suggesting the neighbouring country share the savings with Bangladesh.

Depending on routes, Rahmatullah said, the savings in transport costs could be \$4-50 a tonne against an estimated 18 million tonnes of yearly transit traffic.

Of the cargoes, 16 million tonnes would possibly move between the north-eastern Indian states to its mainland. The remaining 2 million tonnes would be international cargoes through Bangladesh ports, said Rahmatullah.

Bangladesh would require \$7.0 billion over the next decade to develop its transport system, including roads, rails and waterways, for transit, he added.

He suggested the Bangladesh government impose charges for maintenance and operation of infrastructures.

"There have to be some

charges. It is allowed under WTO [World Trade Organisation] rules. Bangladesh has the right to charge.

Rahmatullah also favoured charges for environmental costs, congestions and overheads.

To reap the advantage of transit faster, he suggested both Bangladesh and India speed up infrastructure building by removing procedural delays.

As an immediate solution, he recommended transhipment in the meantime of making railway and other infrastructures ready for transit. Another option, he said, could be a jointventure trucking company by investors from Bangladesh, India, Nepal and Bhutan.

The vehicles under the joint venture would have double registration and a special colour for smooth transportation, he said.

Khondaker Azharul Haq, a water expert, said there was a lot of confusion about the gains for Bangladesh. It must be clear how much in terms of benefits the country would get out of allowing the transit facilities.

"It is quite clear that transit will be beneficial for everyone," said Pinak Ranjan Chakravarty, a former Indian envoy to Dhaka.
