Politicisation of police must be resisted

Says US envoy Mozena

Politicisation of police must be resisted for the sake of democracy, said US Ambassador to Bangladesh Dan W Mozena in Rajshahi yesterday.

"It is very important in democracy that police not be politicised. In every country, there is always some pressure to politicise police. And I encourage the police, I encourage the government of

Bangladesh or America or other countries to resist that pressure," he said. The ambassador was talking to reporters at Police

Academy, Shardah in Rajshahi after distributing certificates to 32 police officials who graduated from a communitybased policing course. The course, "Ethical Leadership", was organised by the US

Agency for International Development, Bangladesh Police, The Asia Foundation, the US Department of Justice's International Criminal Investigative Training Assistance Program and Portland Police Bureau. He said an effective and well trained police force helps

ensure the rule of law which is the central element of every successful democracy in the world. "Today's graduates are helping to build a police force

appropriate for the new Bangladesh, the golden Bangladesh, the middle-income Bangladesh that I fervently believe is possible over the next decade or two," he added. The ambassador said community policing can change

the face of security in Bangladesh and it would make Bangladesh more secure than ever. He said police in Bangladesh are trying to be better at

their jobs and the Bangladesh government is working with other countries to prevent terrorism. In April, 32 graduates will be selected based on their knowledge of and commitment to community policing

principals and field operations to continue the course after the programme is finished. Inspector General of Police Hassan Mahmood Khandakar attended the programme as the chief guest with the acad-

emy Principal Naim Ahmed in the chair. Mozena visited Boalia Police Station in the city and

Charghat Police Station at the district. Deputy Inspector General of Police Siddiqur Rahman; The Asia Foundation Project Director Shanna O'Reilly and its Country Representative Hasan Mazumdar; and Bret Barnum from Portland Police Bureau were also present.

Two suspected robbers were beaten to death by a mob in Banshkhali upazila of the port city early yesterday. Police could not identify the deceased.

Sources said a gang of at least 25 robbers swooped on the house of one Ansarul Hoque at Kotpara village of Katharia union under the upazila around 1:00am.

Ansarul, an expatriate in Greece, recently came home on a vacation. Keeping the inmates of the house hostage at gunpoint, the robbers looted valuables worth Tk 16 lakh, said Officer-in-Charge (OC) Shahjahan Khan of Banshkhali Police Station.

Hearing screaming of the dwellers, the villagers rushed in and caught two of them chasing the fleeing robbers.

The agitating mob beat the duo leaving them dead on the spot, said the OC.

Ansarul filed a robbery case, while police filed another for murder.

The bodies were sent to Chittagong Medical College for autopsies. None could be arrested in this connection, Shahjahan added.

Hearing on charges against Kamaruzzaman deferred

The International Crimes Tribunal yesterday deferred till March 18 the hearing on charge framing against Jamaat leader Muhammad Kamaruzzaman in connection with crimes against humanity committed during the Liberation War of 1971.

The tribunal led by its Chairman Justice Md Nizamul Huq passed the order following an adjournment prayer moved by the defence counsels of Kamaruzzaman.

After the court began its proceedings yesterday, counsel Tajul Islam said they were not prepared for placing arguments as they could not go through all of the relevant documents and CDs [compact discs] given by the prosecution.

On February 7, the defence collected 5,248page documents and 29 CDs containing 30-40 hours of video and news footage, he said, adding that it took them a week to make copies of those documents.

Upon hearing the prayer, the tribunal chairman passed the order noting that this was the first application from Kamaruzzaman and fixed March 18 for holding the hearing on charge framing against the Jamaat assistant secretary general.

Kamaruzzaman was produced before the court yesterday. He is facing nine charges of crimes against humanity. He is among six Jamaat leaders, including its former chief Ghulam Azam, and two BNP leaders, facing such charges at the tribunal.
