Bangladesh Hockey Federation (BHF) renewed their association long-time ally Green Delta Insurance Company to sponsor them for the leagues for the next three seasons.

An agreement to this effect was signed between BHF and the insurance company at the Bangladesh Olympic Association conference room yesterday.

According to the agreement, Green Delta Insurance Company will provide the BHF with Tk 40 lakh to host the Premier, First and Second Division Hockey Leagues for the next three seasons (2012-2014).

The insurance company will provide fifty per cent of the total amount in the current year to BHF while the remaining amount will be given equally in two phases in the next two years.

"We'll concentrate on organising the league in time. We'll start the premier division league in the first week of May and try to host the second and third division leagues as early as possible," said BHF president Shah M Ziaur Rahman after the signing ceremony.

BHF president and Chief of Air Staff Air Marshal Shah M Ziaur Rahman and Green Delta Insurance Company Limited's managing director Nasir Uddin Ahmed Chowdhury signed the deal on behalf of their respective organisations.

BHF general secretary Khaja Rahmatullah said, "As there are two international tournaments ahead (AHF Cup and U-21 Asia Cup), we are deferring the start of the premier league despite the transfers already being over."

It is not the intention of this article to be confrontational in any manner. It merely attempts to put forward an appeal to the powers that be. This is an appeal to be considerate to a class of individuals -- cricketers in this case -- who are one of the MAJOR STAKEHOLDERS of the game in Bangladesh. Even the smallest minority of our citizens have their rights protected under the Constitution of Bangladesh. By that definition, to be wiped out as an entity from the existing Constitution of the Board is not

just discrimination, it is tantamount to sporting genocide. Ours is a nation still trying to find its way in the hurly-burly world of international cricket. There is a need for administrators, organisers, sponsors and, not least, the people who have actually played the game to put their collective best foot forward, so that the game thrives in our country to its fullest potential. Cricketers, as such, have already long been serving their sport -- they merely wish to continue their involvement in a higher forum. This they want to do without prejudice. Please do not sit on judgment otherwise. Cricketers, as a community, have achieved all there was to achieve within the boundary ropes. There is still a role for them now beyond the boundary. Let us not deny them. There is much to gain from
