## Govt creating Stimulus offered to stock losers

Govt allows 50pc interest waiver, IPO quota for affected small investors

Small investors who suffered losses due to the recent stock market slump will get a 50 percent waiver of interest on loans, the finance minister said yesterday.

The interest to be waived must be accrued within the 2011 calendar year or financial year 2011-12.

"The order will come into effect from

Monday [today]," AMA Muhith revealed to reporters as he emerged from a meeting at his secretariat office.

The government has also decided to give the affected small investors a scope to pay the remaining 50 percent of the interest through quarterly instalments in three years.


