Under trial prisoner dies

An under trial prisoner died at Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital on Saturday night. The dead was identified as Md. Abdus Salam 50, son of late Belayet Hossain of Gopalganj under Dinajpur Sadar upazila. Md. Aslam Iqbal, officer in-charge of Dinajpur police station, quoting jail authorities, said Aslam was hospitalized at jail hospital after he fell sick on Friday night. Later he was shifted to Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital on Saturday morning where he died at around 11.30pm.

Youth jailed for stalking

A mobile court sentenced a youth to three months simple jail yesterday afternoon at Thakurgaon Government Girls' High School Centre in the town for sexually harassing a SSC examinee. The convict was Jahangir Alam, 18, son of Dabiruddin of Shangaon village under Baliadangi upazila. Police said a SSC examinee of Perpugi village under Sadar upazila came to sit for examination at the centre. The boy followed her and came to the school. Just before start of the examination in the morning, the boy told her something but the girl refuted the proposal. At this, the boy slapped the girl in the room. Hall invigilators caught him and informed police.

Shops keep shutters down

Shops owners kept their shutters down for two hours yesterday in Rohonpur municipal area of Gomostapur upazila, brought out a procession, held a rally and submitted a memorandum to upazila nirbahi officer protesting arrest of a businessman. Before submitting the memorandum, the speakers said at the rally, held at upazila parishad premises, that local Jubo League leader Shamirul Islam Mukul filed an extortion case with Gomostapur police station against Ruhul Kuddus Sentu, a medicine shop owner on Wednesday. Police arrested him the same day. Terming it a false case they demanded immediate release of the trader.

Trader found dead

A trader was found dead at Bagulat village in Kumarkhali upazila on Saturday night. The deceased was identified as Alam Sheikh, 42, a sack trader and son of Khaiber Ali Sheikh of Shanpukur village of the upazila. Local sources said Alam was returning to his home from Bashgram Bazaar when the criminals slaughtered him at a garden of the village. Local people found his body yesterday morning.

Young man murdered

UNB, Jessore

A young man, who went missing on Friday night, was found dead at a garden at Nityanandapur village in Sadar upazila on Saturday night. The deceased was identified as Nazmul Gazi, 24, son of late Moksed Ali Gazi of Mathurapur village in the upazila. Kotwali police said Nazmul, who used to ferry people on his motorbike for money, went out of his house on Friday night and did not return home. Local people found the body dumped at the garden at night and informed the police. Later, the law enforcers recovered the body that bore stab injury marks and sent it to hospital morgue for autopsy.

TWO INCIDENTS IN B'BARIA, MADARIPUR

Two killed, 60 hurt as rival villagers clash

Two people were killed and at least 60 others injured in two incident of clashes between rival groups of villagers in Brahmanbaria and Madaripur districts yesterday.

A man was killed and over 50 people were injured in a clash between two rival groups at Bhoirabnagar village in Nabinagar upazila of Brahmanbaria yesterday.

Police said over 100 houses were also looted and damaged during the two-hour long clash.

The deceased was identified as Abul Miah, 35, son of Dhanu Miah of the village, reports UNB.

Police and witnesses said, there had a longstanding dispute between Taher Miah and Yunus Miah over establishing supremacy at the village.

As a sequel to the conflict, Taher Miah and his cohorts locked in an altercation with their rivals over a trifling matter in the morning.

Later, both the groups equipped with lethal weapons and sticks attacked each other, killing Abul Miah on

the spot and injuring over 50 people from both sides.

On information, police rushed to the spot and charged batons on the rowdy villagers to disperse them. They also arrested four people from the spot.

Among the injured, two were sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital while the rest taken to local hospitals and clinics.

In another clash on the previous day, at least 20 people were injured at Goalnagar village in Nasirnagar upazila.

Locals said there was a longstanding enmity between Gias Uddin and Abul Kashem of the village over a piece of land.

They said an altercation ensued between them over the matter in the morning. Later, both the groups equipped with lethal weapons and sticks locked into an hour-long clash that left 20 people injured from both sides.

Of the injured, Habibur Rahman, 38, Abul Hossain, 45, Akter Hossain, 30, Zakir Hossain, 35, and Din Islam, 23, were admitted to different hospitals and clinics in

critical condition while others were released after first aid.

In Madaripur, a man was killed and 10 others were injured in a clash between two rival groups over a piece of disputed land at Bebarikandi village in Shibchar upazila yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Fazlu Akhand, 57, of the village, reports the wire service.

Officer in-charge (OC) of Shibchar PS said Fazlu and his nephew Badsha Akhand had long been at loggerheads over the ownership of the land.

The clash ensued as Badsha locked in an altercation with his uncle over the issue at about 10:00 am. At one stage, Badsha hacked Fazlu with a sharp weapon, leaving him critically injured.

Hearing the news, supporters of Fazlu attacked Badsha and his men, triggering a violent clash that left 10 people from both sides injured.

Fazlu was taken to the local health complex where doctors declared him dead.

Dinajpur miners call off strike

Mine workers at Madhyapara Granite Mining Company Ltd (MGMCL) called off their indefinite strike on Saturday afternoon following a meeting between the miners and officials.

All 289 miners went on an indefinite strike on Thursday morning protesting assault on a miner by an official on the previous day.

After the two-hour meeting, the miners returned to their work at around 1:00pm.

Sources said, at the meeting the MGMCL authorities took the allegation of the miners into consideration and asked them to file a complaint officially. They also ensured the miners of taking action after a probe into the incident.

Sources said that a Deputy Assistant Engineer of mining slapped a worker while he was working at the mine's underground on Wednesday afternoon.

During the incident, the official also hurled abuse at the worker, the miners alleged.

Extortionists stab trader

Extortionists slabbled a cloth vendor in Madina Market area of the city on Saturday for his refusal to pay tolls.

The injured was identified as Zillur Rahman, 28, son of late Aftab Mia of Uttar Baghbari area of the city.

Sources said some extortionists demanded money from the victim a few days ago. Being failed to realise the money, the gang intercepted his rickshaw van in the area at about 3:30pm and hacked him with sharp weapons, leaving him critically injured.

He was rushed to Sylhet Osmani Medical College Hospital. A case was filed.

College boy murdered

A college student was found dead in Narsingdi Sadar upazila yesterday morning hours after he went missing.

Sumon Miah, 20, a BA first year student of Narsingdi Government College, was stabbed in his throat and abdomen, said Asaduzzaman, officer in-charge of Narsingdi Sadar police station.

Quoting victim's father Rowshan Miah, police said Sumon went out of his Daripara residence Saturday evening but he did not return home at night.

Local people found Sumon's body at a banana field adjacent to his house around 8:30am yesterday.

4 Shibir men held with jihadi books

Four Shibir men were arrested while trying to hold a secret meeting at a local student hostel near Court Toli Islami Adorsha Madrasa Moslem Uddin, haling from Sundargonj upazila in Gaibandha district.

OC of Patgram PS Farid Uddin said, following a tip-off, a team of Patgram police raided Manik Student Hostel near Islami Adorsha Madrasa and arrested the four Shibir men along with the jihadi books.

A case has been filed against the arrestees with Patgram PS, police said.

DINAJPUR TEXTILE INSTITUTE

Students stage protest alleging corruption by principal

The principal of Dinajpur Textile Institute had to leave office yesterday in face of student protest for alleged corruption.

The agitated students also boycotted their classes, burnt an effigy of Principal MM Zahurul Haque Rabbani and demanded his removal immediately.

Ashiqul Islam Limon, a final year student and convener of Chhatra Sangram Parishad, said they had to pay Tk 3,200 as fee to sit for examinations in July, 2011. The students termed the

amount exorbitant and demanded the removal of the principal. Following the fee hike, Zahurul Haque went on leave, said Limon.

The agitation erupted again when the principal came back to the campus yesterday morning.

At one stage, the students confined him to his office for about three hours. Later, the principal left the campus under police escort.

In 2008, the principal was caught red-handed by the law enforcers while taking bribe from admission seekers, said campus sources. Contacted, the principal refuted the allegations.
