#### Resolve caretaker issue soon: Inu

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal President Hasanul Haq Inu yesterday urged government to resolve the caretaker government issue and bilateral problems with India immediately to weaken the "nexus of conspirators".

"We want to return to power again with people's verdict in our favour. Therefore, we do not want to keep pending the caretaker government issue, and dialogue is imperative to resolve this", said Inu, speaking on the thanksgiving motion of the president's address.

Inu, however, did not elaborate on the conspirators, but said it was BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia who was engaged in conspiracy against the country in the name of anti-government movement on caretaker government issue.

Also a key leader in the ruling Awami League-led grand alliance, Inu blasted the government for its failure to control price hike of essentials, maintain law and order, stabilise share market, and criminal activities of Bangladesh Chhatra League.

#### German expats for fair probe into journo couple murder

Bangladeshi expatriates in Germany yesterday formed a human chain on the United Nations (UN) premises at Bonn in Germany, demanding a fair investigation into the murder of journalist couple Sagar Sarowar and Meherun Runi.

They also submitted a memorandum to the UN Secretary General Ban Ki Moon demanding transparency in the investigation of the case and immediate arrest of the killers, says a press release.

Dozens of Bangladeshi expatriates and citizens of other countries, including Sagar's former colleagues in Germany, joined the programme from 9:00am to 9:30am, expressing doubts whether the killers of the couple will ever be punished.

Sagar worked for Bangla Service of Deutsche Welle from June 2008 to May 2011, after which he joined private TV station Maasranga in Bangladesh as a news editor.

Sagar along with his wife Runi, senior reporter of another TV channel ATN Bangla, were murdered at their apartment in the city's West Rajabazar on February 11.

update of the brutal killing of Sagar-Runi. On behalf of the people, I urge the home minister to deliver speech in the House, informing people of the sensational double murder", he said. Speaking on a point of order, the lone independent MP criti-

cised a recent rule of the High Court in which it asked the information secretary to take steps within 24 hours to ensure the mediado not publish any speculative news report on the incident. On February 28, a HC bench directed the authorities not

to make any statement to the media without any specific development in the ongoing investigation into the murder. Sagar and his wife Runi, both journalists, were killed at

their apartment in the city on February 11. Fazlul Azim said people were eagerly waiting to know the development on the journalist couple murder, but the media were not writing about it following the HC rule. The government has failed to ensure freedom of the media, he said.

# Govt has no right to stay in power

Says Khaleda, terming govt 'deaf, dumb and blind'

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia yesterday said the ruling Awami League-led grand alliance government has become "deaf, dumb and blind" and such government, which has failed to run the country, has no right to stay in power.

She said there is no justice anywhere in the country rather exists double standard of justice [one] for Awami League (AL) and [another] for BNP.

"Awami League is now frequently saying that BNP will create anarchy in the name of rally. In fact, they [AL] will create anarchy to blame the opposition," she said while addressing a reception programme of the newly elected office bearers of Dhaka Bar Association at Institution of Diploma Engineers, Bangladesh in the city.

She said no safety and security exists anywhere, including bedrooms, business and educational organisations and even, the foreigners are not safe in the country.

Khaleda asked the pro-BNP lawyers to ensure victory in the upcoming Supreme Court Bar Association election. "If anyone goes against our panel will be expelled from the party," she warned.

Claiming BNP's founder Ziaur Rahman as proclaimer of the country's independence, Khaleda said Ziaur Rahman had revolted on March 26 and declared independence of Bangladesh on March 27, 1971.
