Enemies' still hatching BNP blames govt for plots to kill me

Hasina tells JS

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday in parliament said her "enemies" are still hatching conspiracies to kill her and her party leaders as they tried to do during the August 21 grenade attack.

"You have noticed that enemies are now desperate to foil the ongoing trial of war criminals.

"That is why I am saying that the grenade attack on August 21 was not the end. Plans are still going on to launch attacks and kill," she said.

Replying to lawmakers' queries, Hasina, also leader of the House, urged her party leaders and activists, irrespective of where they are, to keep watch on the "entire situation very carefully".

She, however, did not name or elaborate about the enemies.

On the grenade attack case follow-up, Hasina hoped that the trial would be completed within the specific timeframe.

On her government's plan to industrialise the country, she said, "A study is going on to manufacture sedan cars in the country."

She also said the industries ministry formulated necessary rules to set up an environment-friendly ship breaking industry with the hope that this industry would play a significant role in eradicating poverty and gain economic growth.

MODERNISING THE ARMED FORCES

Replying to another query, Hasina informed the House in detail about her government's various ongoing and future plans to modernise the Bangladesh army, navy and air force.

The process is going on to transform the

Army Security Unit into Army Security and Intelligence Organisation and increase its manpower and that of Army Embarkation Unit, she said. Hasina informed the JS that her government

already approved formation of a new commando unit, SWADS Command, having 953 personnel and 92 vehicles, under the navy, to launch anti-militant and anti-terrorist operations around the country's maritime boundary.

"The process is underway for the approval of organising structures of BNS Bijoy, BNS Dhaleshwary and BNS Anusandhan for the navy," she added.

hate campaign

Apprehending that the government may "sabotage" the March 12 rally, the opposition BNP yesterday said using state apparatus the ruling party was trying to create fear and confusion among the people about the rally.

"The government itself is talking about sabotage and chaos aiming to foil the rally. It is conducting 'hate campaign' against the rally in the name of sabotage", BNP acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said at a press briefing at party's central office at Nayapaltan in the city.

He said the party feared that the government itself would carry out sabotage and then shifted the blame on the BNP. He also criticised the ministers and ruling party leaders for their provocative remarks over the rally.

The rally will be peaceful but the BNP will not delay announcing tougher programme if the rally is obstructed in any way, Fakhrul said.

"We have taken all preparations for our peaceful programme. We sought help for security reasons from the administration through letter. Yet the ruling party is trying to create fear among the people", he said and asked the government to stop arresting and harassing opposition activists across the country. Referring to the killing of a Saudi Embassy official,

Fakhrul said the diplomatic zone should get top priority for security, but the government failed to do that as it had kept the law enforcers busy in repressing the opposition.

They also expressed sympathy with the Saudi Embassy,

Saudi government and the family members of the deceased. Khalaf Al Ali, a Saudi national who joined the Saudi

Embassy in Dhaka about two years ago, was shot dead some 30 yards off his house in Gulshan area of the city early Tuesday.


