TRAIN HITS PICKUP

6 of a family die in Natore

No gate or guard at level crossing

Six members of a family were killed and another person was injured as a train rammed a pickup van on Bangram railway crossing in Natore sadar upazila of the district yesterday afternoon.

The level crossing has no gate and that is why accidents often occur there, said Jahurul Islam, a resident of Bangram area. At least 10 people including this six were crushed under trains in last three years.

Noor Hossain, officer-in-charge of Naldanga Police Station, said the Parbatipur-bound Ekota Express from Dhaka collided with a pickup van that was trying to run past the railway crossing near Basudevpur Railway Station around 4:30pm.

The dead were identified as Sultan Ahmed, 40, of Khajura village in Natore, his mother Shurjan Bewa, sister Kulsum Khatun, 27, nephew Sajeeb Ahmed, 8, nephew Laboni Akter, 3, and sister-in-law Lovely Begum, 37.

Five passengers of the van died on the spot while Lovely and Saiful Islam, driver of the van, were rushed to Natore Sadar Hospital. Later, Lovely succumbed to her

EC expects to enroll 70 lakh new voters

Voter list updating begins tomorrow

Around 70 lakh new voters across the country are expected to be added to the voter list, estimates the Election Commission (EC) as it begins tomorrow updating the electoral roll.

People aged 18 or above now and those who will be 18 or above on January 1 next year will be registered

as voters, Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad said yesterday.

This may be the last updating before the 10th parliamentary elections scheduled for January, 2014.

The number of voters in the list updated earlier in the middle of 2010 rose by 52 lakh to 8.64 crore.

A total of 8.12 crore voters were

entitled to cast vote in the ninth parliamentary polls held on December 29,2008.

So, around 1.22 crore new voters will be entitled to exercise their franchise in the next parliamentary polls with the total number of voters being some 9.34 crore, according to information received from the EC

The enraged workers vandalised at least 10 vehicles and barricaded the Kaliakoir-Nabinagar road for over three hours, much to the suffering of the commuters.



Upgrading MPs' air tickets illegal

HC verdict says Biman didn't follow Warrant of Precedence

The High Court yesterday declared illegal a Biman decision to upgrade the air tickets of the members of parliament and their family members flouting the Warrant of Precedence.

In its verdict on a writ petition, the court directed the government to upgrade passengers from economy to business class following the serial mentioned in the Warrant of Precedence, and to take effec-

tive steps to save Biman Bangladesh Airlines from bad reputation, financial losses and mismanagement.

Parliament members are in serial number 13 in the Warrant of Precedence, but the Biman board of directors in March 2009 had brought them to number six for upgrading their tickets, Manzill Murshid, counsel for the petitioner, said.
