Invent alternative to formalin

Hasan Mahmud asks scientists

Environment and Forests Minister Hasan Mahmud urged scientists to invent an alternative to formalin for the safe preservation of foodstuff.

He was addressing as the chief guest at the

concluding ceremony of the 9th Annual Scientific Conference of Chittagong University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (CUVAS) in a city hotel on Thursday evening. The theme of the conference was "Food

Safety in Bangladesh: Issues and Challenges". Around 200 researchers from countries including Denmark, India, Japan and Pakistan attended the two-day conference.

Hasan said detrimental chemicals like formalin are frequently used to preserve foodstuff as the country's existing laws on ensuring safe food are not sufficient to prevent the adulteration of food.

Though the population increased three times in the last fifty years, the country does not need to import "that much of foodstuff" as scientists and researchers helped increase the production of crops several fold, he said.

Developing consciousness, alongside

application of laws, in people from all walks of

life is necessary to ensure safe food and prevent environmental pollution, he added. He expressed hope that CUVAS would play

a vital role, not only in educating students but also in presenting developments in food preservation techniques.

University Grants Commission member Prof Dr Akhter Hossain and Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Pran Gopal Datta were present at the programme with CUVAS Vice Chancellor Prof DrASMahfuzul Bari in the chair.

Two of the arrestees, Nur-e-alam Mohammad Shihab Uddin and Abdul Matin, are students of Dhaka University while the third one, Abdul Matin, is a student of Bangladesh Institute of Glass and Ceramic in the city's Tejgaon.

Sub-Inspector Mohammad Alam Mian of New Market Police Station said the trio was shouting slogans against the government while holding a banner.

Our Sylhet correspondent reports: Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested two of the operatives, also students of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology, distributing the outfit's leaflets before Sheikhghat Boro Mosque in Sylhet city after Juma prayers.

The arrestees are Jewel Ahmed, in his final year at Bachelor of Business Administration and hailing from Sridhara village in Beanibazar upazila, and Atique Sarfaraj, of the civil and environmental engineering department and hailing from Barohatia area of Chittagong.

Rab handed them over to Sylhet Kotwali Police Station in the evening after filing a case in this connection.

Robbers shoot two

Robbers shot and wounded two people, including a student, at Demra in the capital yesterday morning. Anik, 12, a class VI student

hospital that the gang of eight to ten was led by local goons Alamgir and Shamsuddin. They are notorious criminals.

Eight people were killed and six others injured in road accidents in Chittagong, Chapainawabganj, Rangpur, and Pabna yesterday and Thursday.

Our staff correspondent from Ctg reports: Five persons were killed and six others injured as an improvised passenger vehicle collided head-on with a covered van in Sitakunda upazila yesterday.

Four of the deceased were identified as Md Kawser, 20, son of Baten Mia of Muradnagar of Comilla, Monir Hossain Hira, 35, son of Hiron Mia of Baghaura of Brahmanbaria, the passenger vehicle driver Md Ershad, 30, son of Kanchan Mia of Kulgaon of Bayezid in Chittagong, and Hazera Begum, 20, of Chittagong. Identity of the other victim aged around 16 could not be known immediately while police suspected him to be the helper.

The accident took place near Shitalpur High School, leaving 10 persons, all on board the passenger vehicle, injured.

Highway police and locals immediately sent the injured to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) where doctors declared four of them dead, said Sub-



Woman 'burnt by husband' dies

A housewife succumbed to her burn injuries yesterday, thirteen days after she was set on fire allegedly by her husband for dowry in Khagrachhari.

Rohima Begum, 18, died around 5:30am at Chittagong Medical College Hospital, where she was admitted on March 1 with more than 50 percent of her body covered in burn injuries, said her father Abdur Rahman. Rohima's husband

Mohammad Jamal Hossain and in-laws allegedly set her ablaze at their residence at Pilotfarm in Panchhari upazila of Khagrachhari on February 25 as she refused to pay Jamal Tk 50,000 as dowry.

She was rushed to Panchhari upazila health complex and then shifted to Khagrachhari Adhunik Sadar Hospital.

Panchhari police said they arrested Jamal and Jahanara, Rohima's sister in-law, from their house on the night of incident. Rohima's mother Rufia Bagum filed a case in this regard with Panchhari Police Station.
